Paint Drying Ovens
 How would you like to spend part of your day working in an oven? There are men who do it, reports the Idaho Medical Association. They are workers who have to enter paint drying ovens for short intervals from time to time for servicing chores—with temperatures of 300 to 400 degrees.
 A communication in a recent Journal of the American Medical Association says that if they stay no longer than five or ten minutes there should be no health problem for healthy individuals, even at these fierce temperatures.
 The report was in response to a query from a physician regarding health hazards of workers exposed to this excessive degree of heat.
 The key to handling the job is to work in short intervals of five minutes or so. With heavy clothing,

mittens and reflective outer garments, the time could be extended to 10 to 15 minutes. For longer than 15 minutes, a self-contained individual cooling unit would be required.
 Nine out of ten forest fires can be prevented. Care and caution are essential tools in the forest, if they are used by everyone perhaps we wouldn't always need to be prepared with shovels, axes and buckets.

Kendrick Camper Karavan On Magruder Pass Trip

Over the three-day holiday, six food-laden pickup trucks belonging to an adventurous Kendrick Camper Klub group of five and one "tag-alonger," traveled some 525 miles over the early mountain route of the Nez Perce. The mountain climbing started near Red River Ranger Station and came off the former Nez Perce trail near Darby, Mont. The return trip was made by Lolo Pass, Mont., and down the Lochsa river on Rt. 12, where rain on that night did not dampen the spirits of the group. Highlights were the scenery stops and the side trips, the most exciting of which was eating lunch at the site of the now abandoned Burnt Knob Lookout, at 8,900 ft. The most restful was camping overnight at Chuckling Creek campground at some 10,000 feet, on the Nez Perce Pass, near Magruder Crossing. Gold-pan Lake was interesting and often stops were just for looking at Idaho's unspoiled beauty in all directions. In Montana, a side trip was made at Stevensville, to see the restored St. Mary's Mission which in 1840 was inspired by Father DeSmet of the then first mission in use at Cataldo, in Idaho. Warm nights, beautiful days, bright moonlight, good meals and enjoyable fellowship made the outing unforgettable.
