**ACCIDENTAL POISONING**

Although children are all too often the victims of accidental poisoning in the home, the fact is that more than two-thirds of such accidents happen to people older than 14.  
 To reduce the hazard of accidental poisoning the Idaho Medical Association suggests the following safeguards—Read all labels carefully and protect them. Know exactly what is in the container and do not reuse it. Medicines may change with age, becoming weaker or stronger. Discard them when they are old or no longer needed. Keep medicines for internal use entirely apart from those for external use.  
 Do not take medicine in the dark. Read labels at least twice before taking medicine or using hazardous products.

Keep medicines and pills in separate containers, never mixing them. Never put hazardous substances in kitchen utensils. Never allow insect and rodent poisons in the kitchen. Common household products like detergents, waxes, kerosene, mothballs, hair sprays and dyes any many others can be lethal, especially for children. They should be kept out of reach of youngsters.

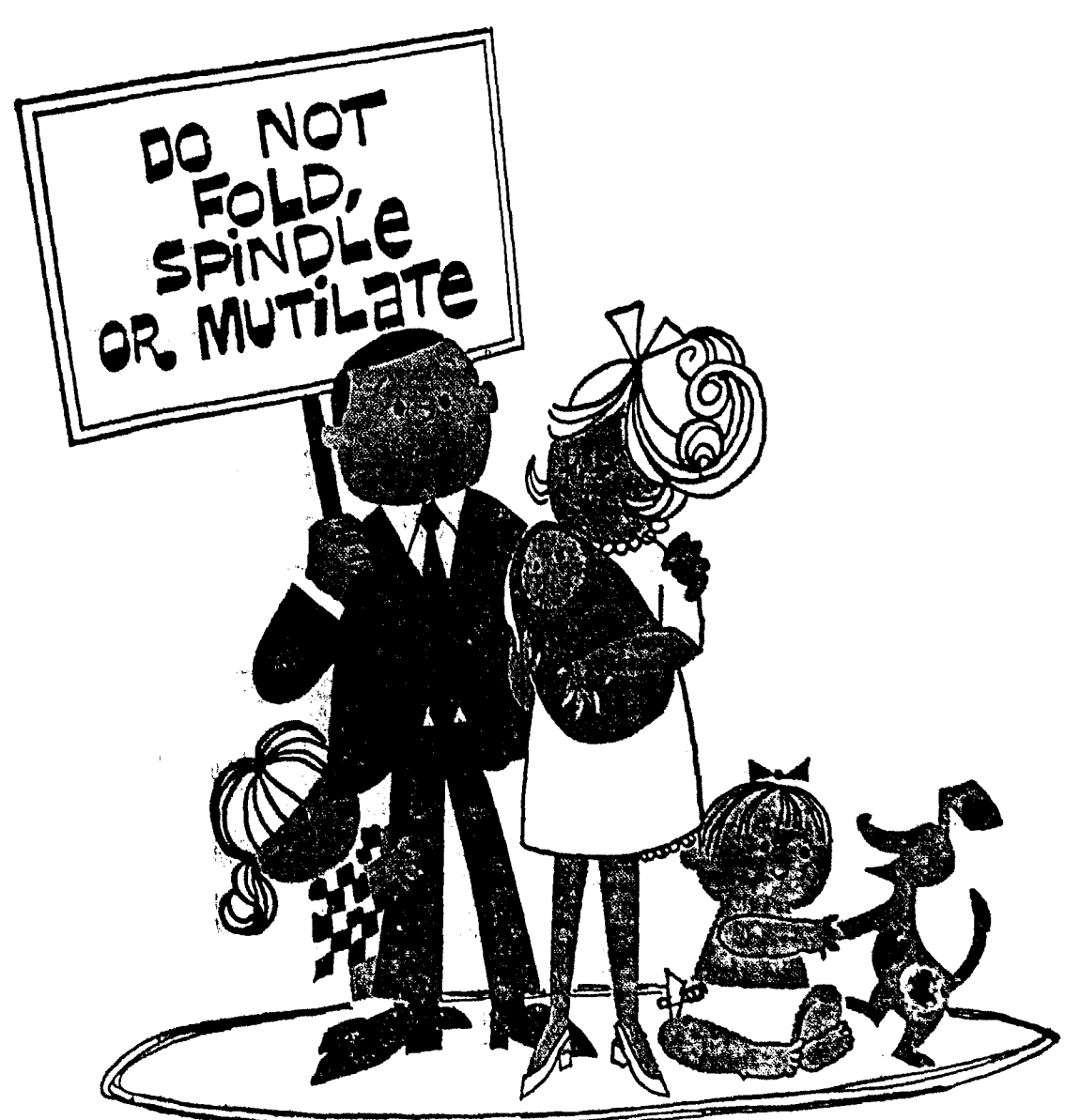
