Home Cookin'...

This week's recipes are just in time for the holidays, and they really sound delicious. These will come in handy for anyone wanting to make them for the holidays.

They are from the kitchen files of Janet Natl, so you know they will be delicious.

NATURAL HEALTH CANDY

(no cook)

(first 5 ingredients)

- 1/2 pound dates
- 1 pound figs
- 2 cups walnuts
- 1/2 cup raisins
- 1 pound dried apricots

1 tsp grated orange rind
Sesame seeds or shredded coconut, finely chopped walnuts.

Put first five ingredients through food grinder. Add orange juice and mix well. Press into buttered pan. Allow to set for at least 2 hours.

APRICOT NUGGETS

(make now for Christmas, no cook)

- 1-11 oz. pkg. apricots, ground
- 1 pound powdered sugar
- 6 tbl. melted margarine
- 2 tbl. orange juice
- 1/2 tsp. vanilla
- 1 cup nuts or 1 1/2 cup coconut

Combine first five ingredients. Roll in nuts or coconut. Store in refrigerator at least two weeks before serving.

CRACKER JACKS

- 1 cup sugar
- 1/3 cup water
- 1/3 cup molasses
- 1/4 cup butter
- 1/2 teaspoon salt

Cook until it forms a brittle ball in cold water. Pour over 3 quarts popped corn and 1/2 cup salted peanuts. Cool to serve.

PEANUT BUTTER FUDGE

- 1 pt. marshmallow creme
- 1 cup chunky peanut butter
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 2 cups sugar
- 2/3 cup milk

Combine in a large warm mixing bowl, marshmallow creme, peanut butter and vanilla. Combine sugar and milk in a heavy saucepan. Cook sugar mixture to soft-ball stage 235 degrees. Pour over peanut butter mixture. Stir until well mixed. Spread into a buttered 8"x9" pan. Cool.—Cut into squares.

POP-CORN BALLS

(foolproof)

- 1/2 lb. corn (unpopped)
- 1 cup sugar
- 1 cup corn syrup
- 1 pkg. jello—any flavor or color

Pop corn. Put in large pan and place in 250 degree oven to keep warm. Bring sugar, syrup and jello to a boil. Stir until dissolved. Pour over corn. Stir. Form balls with greased hands, and place on waxed paper.

Spread into a buttered 8"x9" pan. Cool.—Cut into squares.

TWO FLAVOR FUDGE

Combine in saucepan—

- 2 cups brown sugar
- 1 cup sugar
- 1 cup canned milk
- 1/2 cup margarine

Bring to boil and boil for 15 minutes, stirring constantly. Add—

- 1-5-10 oz. jar marshmallow creme
- and 1 6 oz. pkg. butterscotch chips
- and 1 6-oz. pkg. chocolate chips
- or semi-sweet morsels. Stir until melted and smooth. Add 1 teaspoon vanilla and 1 cup chopped walnuts.

Pour into greased 8x13 pan. Makes about 2 1/2 pounds.

APPLE-ETTES

Peel and cube about 5 apples and make an unthickened sauce. Mash well. Refrigerate 1/2 cup sauce. When cold, thoroughly dissolve 2 envelopes unflavored gelatin in it. Mix 2 cups of sugar with remaining sauce. Add gelatin and apple mixture and boil 15 minutes stirring often. Remove from heat.

Add 1 cup chopped walnuts and blend. Pour into lightly buttered 8x12 inch pan. Place in refrigerator until set. Cut into squares and roll each square in powdered sugar. Place on waxed paper.

SAUERKRAUT SURPRISE CAKE

(tastes like coconut cake)

Moist, tender—

- 2/3 cup butter
- 3 eggs
- 2 1/2 cup flour
- 1/4 tsp. salt
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 1 1/2 cups sugar
- 1/2 cup cocoa
- 1 tsp. soda
- 1 cup water
- 2/3 cup sauerkraut, drained, chopped and washed.

Combine sugar and butter. Add eggs, one at a time. Add vanilla. Stir until well blended.

Add sifted dry ingredients to creamed mixture. Add water. Stir. Stir in kraut. Pour into greased pan. Bake 350 degrees for 30 min.
