

 AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE LEVY OF TWENTY-NINE (29) MILLS FOR GENERAL PURPOSES AND FOR THE LEVY OF SEVEN (7) MILLS FOR THE PAYMENT OF PRINCIPAL AND INTEREST ON GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS AND FOR THE LEVY OF TWO (2) MILLS FOR PARKS & RECREATION AND PROVIDING FOR THE APPROPRIATION OF FUNDS FOR THE CURRENT FISCAL YEAR AND PROVIDING FOR THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS ORDINANCE BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the City of Kendrick, County of Latah, State of Idaho as follows:



**SAVING ELECTRICITY**  
 Saves water and jobs  
 Here's how. Most of our electricity comes from the power plants on the rivers. Dams hold back the water which runs the generators to meet power demand. **WALL INSULATION**

**NOXIOUS WEEDS**

Notice is hereby given this 12 day of March, 1977 pursuant to the Idaho Noxious Weed Law Section 22-2441, Idaho Code, to every person who owns or controls land in Latah County, Idaho, that noxious weeds standing, being or growing on such land shall be destroyed or eradicated by effective cutting, tilling, cropping, pasturing, or treating with chemicals or other effective methods, or combination thereof, approved by the County Weed Superintendent, as often as may be required to prevent the weed from blooming and maturing seeds, or spreading by root, root stalks or other means.

22-2462. Violations— Penalties. Any person knowing of the existence of any noxious weeds on land owned or controlled by him who fails to control or eradicate such weeds in accordance with this act and rules and regulations prescribed thereunder, and any person who intrudes upon any land under quarantine or who moves or causes to be moved any article covered by this act as provided or who prevents or threatens to prevent entry upon land as provided in this act, or who interferes with the carrying out of the provisions of this act, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be subject to a fine not to exceed three hundred dollars (\$300.00) on account of each violation.

**IDAHO DEPT. OF EMPLOYMENT**  
 9 persons were placed on jobs this week through the Idaho Dept. of Employment Job Service, said Frank Hartstein, Moscow local office manager. He said 14 new positions were listed this week, with a total of 15 remaining open at weekend. Included are opportunities for qualified farm equipment operators, statistical collection, waitresses, kitchen helpers, a secretary, bartender, nurse aide, and a cosmetologist. Interested persons should contact the job service office at 221 E. Second, Moscow, for details.

Hartstein further reported that the Latah County jobless total has continued to drop, with 624 persons reporting this week compared to 635 a week ago, and 692 last year at this time. He said 48 new claims for unemployment insurance were taken,

though most were transitional claims following the conclusion of the benefit year for a number of claimants. The actual new claim total was quite low, a trend supported by area unemployment figures for the past week.

Totals for most Latah Co. remained stable, with the exception of Potlatch, where 105 persons reported, down from 110 last week and 146 a year ago. Totals for other areas: Moscow, 275, down slightly from 275, while 309 reported at this time a year ago; Genesee, 10-11 and 20; Troy-Deary-Bovill, 220-222- and 200; Kendrick, 16, 17, and 17.

Hartstein said the decline in total claims is expected to continue with the anticipated cutoff of extended benefits through legislative action in late March or early April.
