Home Cookin'...

For the busy and 'time-limited' homemaker, here are a couple of casseroles that can be tossed together in a hurry or prepared a day or two in advance. The next few weeks will be hectic and busy with not nearly enough hours in a day.

Easy Hamburger Casserole
1 lb. ground beef
1 cup uncooked rice, regular
1 small onion
1/2 cup chopped celery
1 can cream of mushroom soup
1 can onion soup

Combine ground beef with uncooked rice, onion and celery in a 2-quart greased casserole. Blend the soups together and stir into rice mixture. Cover and bake at 350 degrees for one hour or until rice is tender.

Chicken Bake

1/4 cup margarine
1/4 cup flour
1 teaspoon salt
Pepper, if desired
2 cups cut-up celery
1 cup chicken broth
1/2 cup milk
2 cups cubed, cooked chicken
1/2 cup buttered bread crumbs

Cook celery in boiling salted water until tender; drain. Melt margarine in skillet, stir in flour, salt and pepper. Add chicken broth and milk gradually, stirring until smooth and thickened. Alternate layers of chicken and celery in greased 8-inch square baking dish and pour the hot sauce over top. Sprinkle with buttered bread crumbs. Bake 25 minutes at 400 degrees.

AN OTOPLASTY

An otoplasty is an operation in which protruding ears are set back closer to the head.

The operation is sometimes done in a hospital, but can be performed as an outpatient procedure, depending on the patient, the surgeon, and whether general or local anesthesia is used, according to the Idaho Medical Association.

The usual approach is to make the incision behind the ear, then weaken the cartilage by scoring or scratching. Stay sutures are then placed in the cartilage to hold the new position.

Because the incision is made behind the ear, no scar will show.

Bandages are usually worn for several days. The ears should be wrapped or taped at night for several weeks to protect the ears while sleeping. This completes the recovery period, although the ears may be sore or tender to the touch for a few months following surgery.

Fish and Game Dept. Notes "Pluses" For Idaho Wildlife

The National Wildlife Federation reports the nation's wildlife lost "points" again during 1976, but in Idaho there were some plus points.

The Federation has published its eighth Environmental Quality Index for the United States showing that on a scale of 100 points, wildlife has dropped from a 58 rating in 1969 to a 45 at the end of 1976.

It may be inappropriate to call the strides made for wildlife in Idaho pluses, because in many cases the accomplishments made for this resource have been replacement of earlier losses or lessening the impact of losses.

In this category of maintaining the status quo are the mitigation projects that have come to fruition during the past several months.

Heading the list is an interim agreement with the Bureau of Reclamation that will help replace wildlife—mostly big game and water fowl—lost when the Teton and Firie projects were built in eastern Idaho. Through this agreement \$182,600 is freed to develop land exclusively for wildlife.

Coming out of the environmental impact statement on grazing in the Challis area is the assurance from the Bureau of Land Management that bighorn sheep and elk will receive more attention in future management decisions there.

Before leaving office, President Gerald Ford signed a \$58 million appropriation to aid the U. S. Army Corps of Engineers in replacing salmon and steelhead lost to dams on the Lower Snake River.

Although the plan has not been worked out in detail, Idaho is fairly sure that four new anadromous fish hatcheries will be built within her boundaries in the coming years.

Another federal action that points toward an improvement of Idaho's wildlife status is the Sikes Act, an act that makes money available to federal land management agencies for cooperative agreements with state agencies to improve wildlife habitat.

No specific programs have yet been approved for funding but the Idaho Department of Fish and Game in cooperation with the U. S. Forest Service will submit proposals to Congress for help in range burning for elk in northern Idaho.

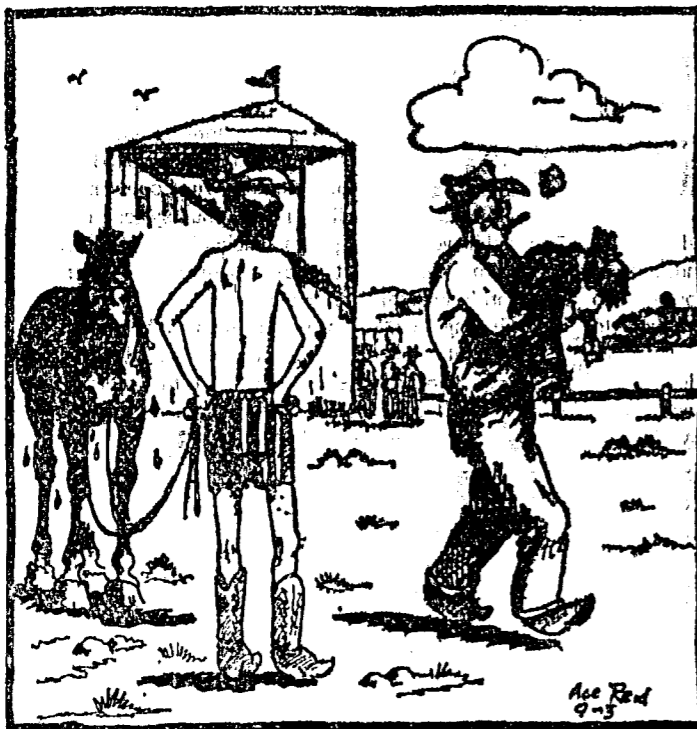

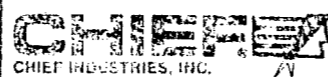
