

## HEARING SCREENING CLINICS

On May 3, 1977 beginning at 9:00 a. m. hearing screening tests will be given at the Grange Hall in Kendrick. The hearing screening tests are for infants, toddlers and preschoolers — any child from 6 months of age to four years of age. The testing is free of charge. However, appointments are required. You may make an appointment by calling Jill Hoogland at 289-4547 after 5:00 p. m. Using special equipment and techniques, a trained examiner will identify children who show evidence of ear infections, fluid in the ears, retracted ear drums, on hearing loss for any reason. This screening clinic is being provided by the Health Department in

cooperation with the Pre-School Satellite Program for Hearing Impaired Children of the Idaho State school for the Deaf and Blind. Health Departments and Satellite Program throughout the State of Idaho are striving, through those early screening clinics to prevent the serious medical, developmental, and educational problems which often result from ear problems and hearing impairment in early childhood. The FHA at Kendrick high school is helping promote and sponsor this program.

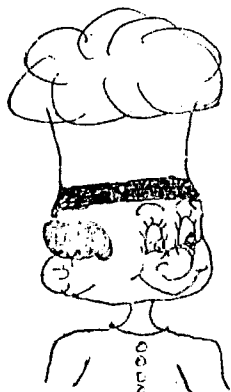
