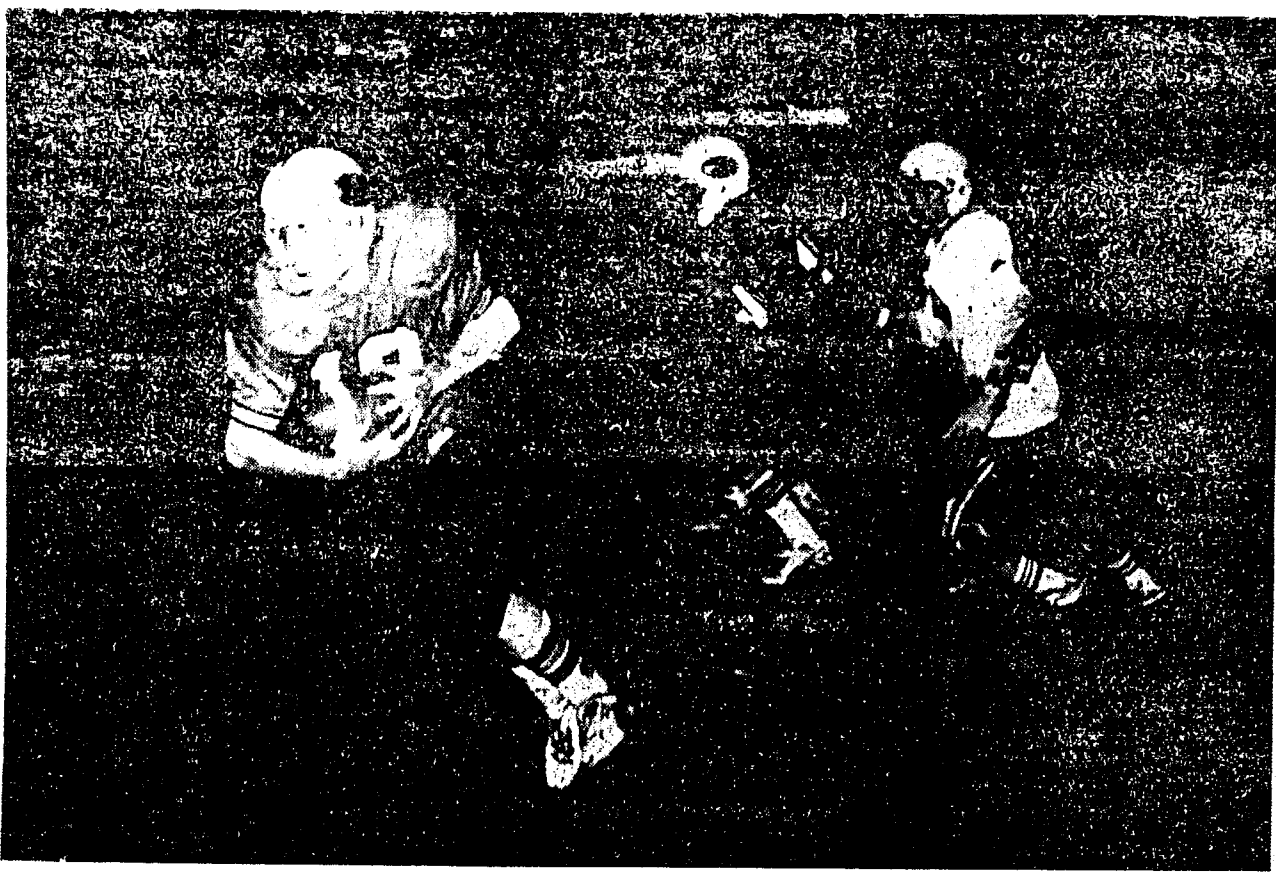

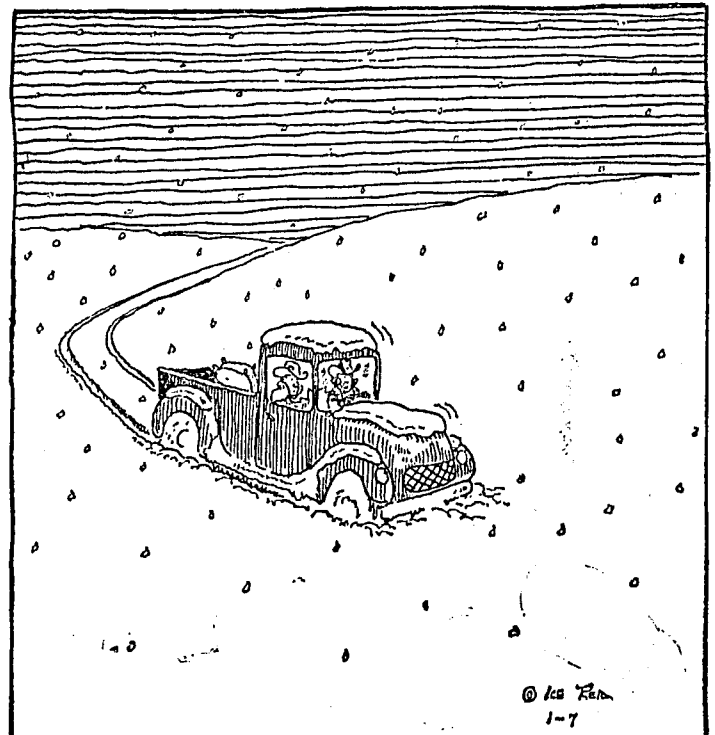

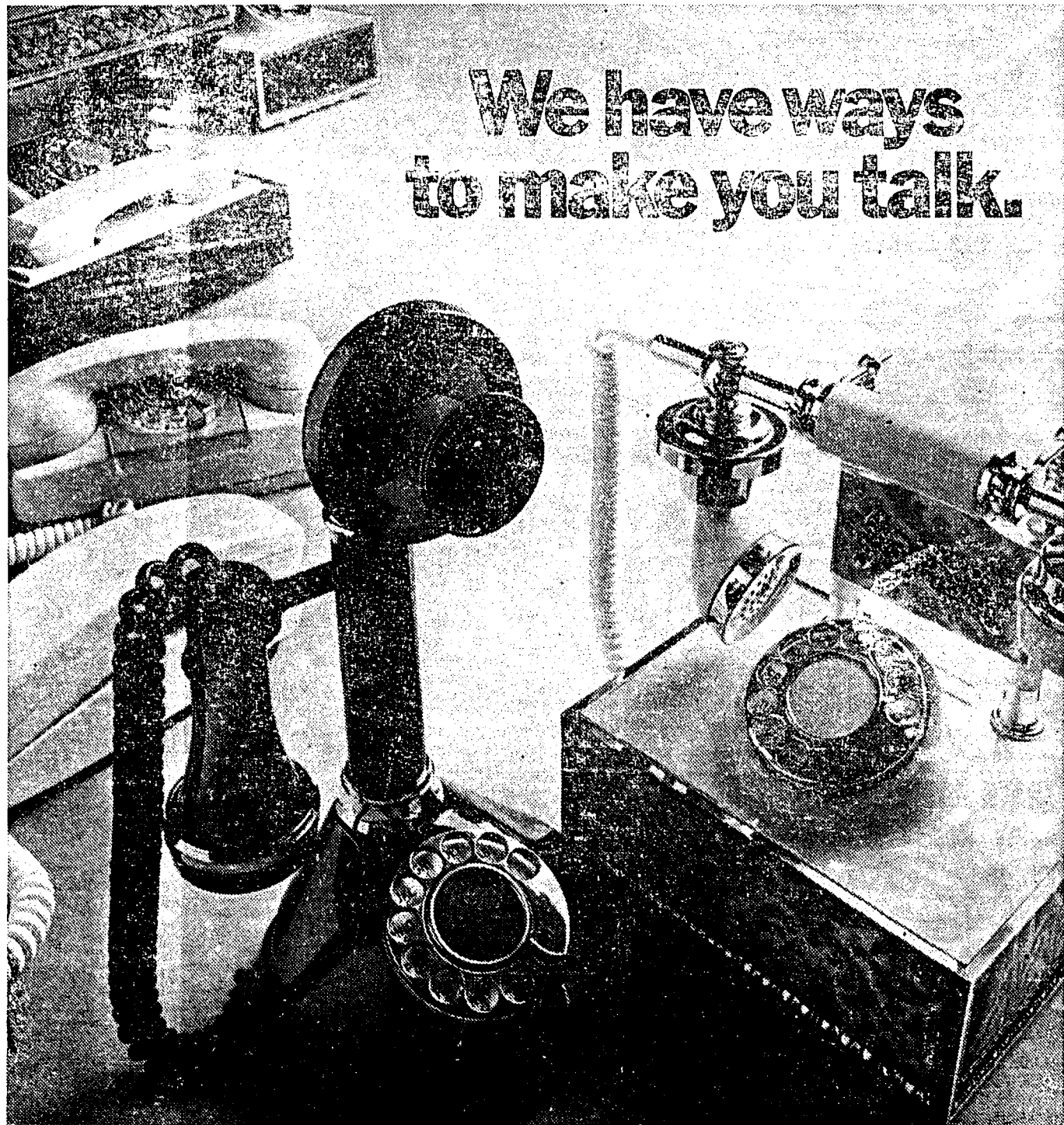

REYE'S SYNDROME

Reye's Syndrome is a serious illness that often is fatal to children. It usually follows shortly after a viral illness such as flu or chicken pox. Of the thousands of children that come down with flu each winter, only a few, statistically, will develop Reye's Syndrome. But for those few it will be very serious.

Usually the child will have completely recovered from the first illness and be back in school or at play before the symptoms of Reye's appear. Sudden, persistent vomiting is almost always the first sign, followed closely by complaints of fatigue, general listlessness and apathy.

If your child shows these symptoms contact your doctor immediately. Mental disorientation occurs soon after the vomiting ceases. The child may become totally irrational—screaming, striking out, and unable to recognize family members and other familiar faces. Unconsciousness soon follows.

Reye's Syndrome is not always fatal. Sixty per cent of children affected in a 1974 epidemic recovered completely, and doctors now are guided by lessons learned during that outbreak.

You can better the odds of recovery by watching your child carefully after any viral illness and by acting quickly to get help if he displays any of the symptoms of Reye's Syndrome.

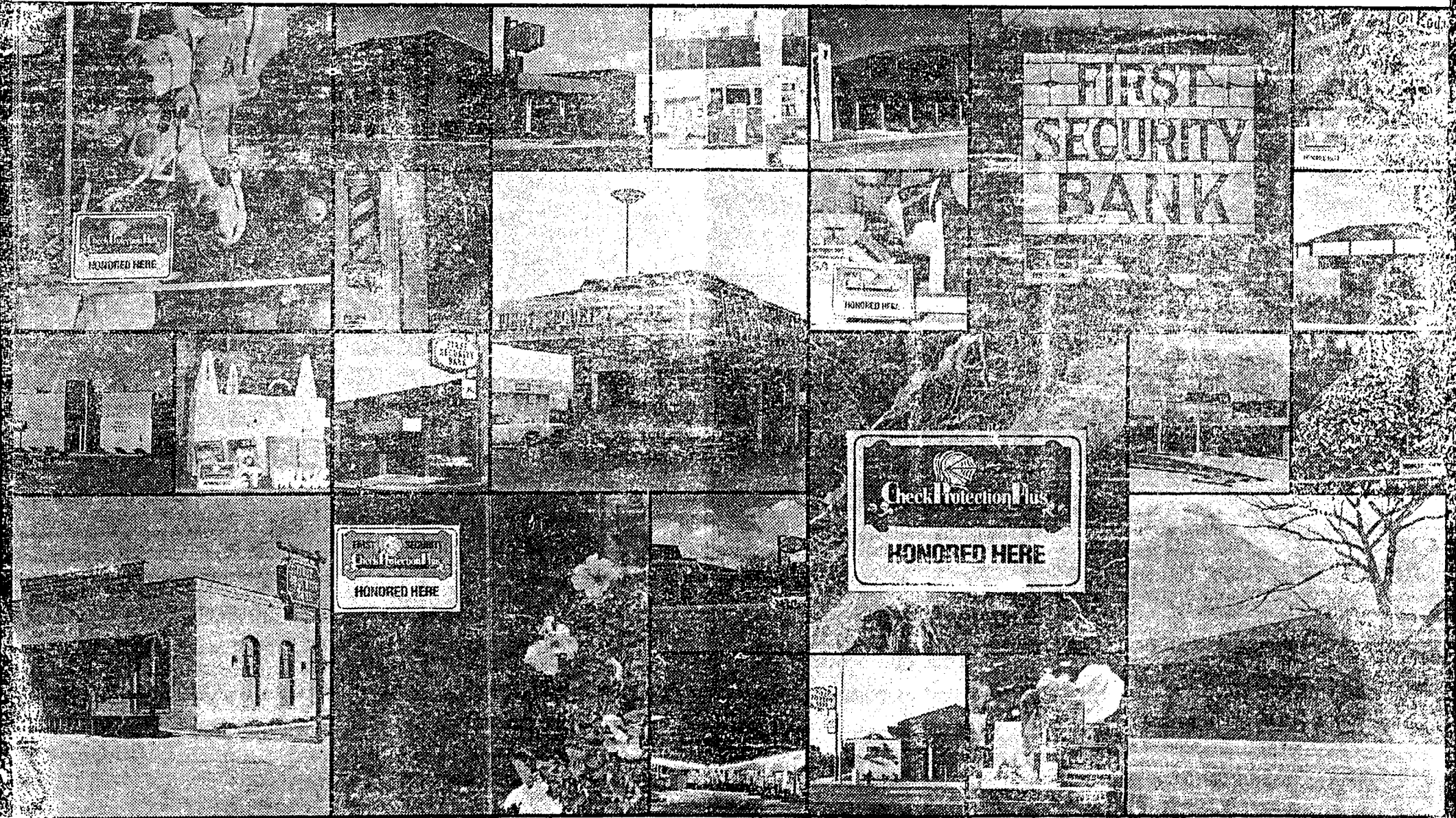
Best of Class for Sunflowers went to Rodney Cook of the 2nd Grade. Tallest of all was Ted Denner's entry from the Fifth Grade.


which said new Title 1, Chapter 7, shall provide and read as follows: 1-7-1. The City of Genesee, Idaho, shall be one precinct, described as follows: Commencing at the northeast corner of section fourteen (14) in township thirty-seven (37), north of range five (5) west of the B.M.; thence south along the east line of section fourteen (14) to the southeast corner of Alder and Willow streets, as the same appears on record of the town of Genesee in the office of the recorder of deeds in and for Latah County and State of Idaho; thence west along the south line of Willow street until it intersects the north and south centerline of section fourteen (14), thence east one quarter (1/4) of a mile on the north line of section fourteen (14), thence south one thousand one hundred and seventy (1170) feet, to the northwest corner of lot three (3) in block four (4) in the West addition to the town of Genesee, as appears of record in the office of the recorder of deeds in and for Latah County, Idaho; thence east to the north and south centerline of section fourteen (14), thence north on said center-section line to the northeast corner of the northeast quarter of section fourteen (14), thence east on the north line of said section fourteen (14), to the northeast corner of said section-fourteen (14), being the place of beginning; 1-7-2. The City Clerk shall keep on file a description of the precinct or precincts. Said description shall be amended by resolution or other order of the City Council.

SECTION 3. Publication. This ordinance shall be published in one (1) issue of the official newspaper of the City. SECTION 4. Effective Date. ORDINANCE 242 AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF GENESSEE, IDAHO, AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 230, TO PROVIDE FOR ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS FOR MOBILE HOMES ON PRIVATE LOTS IN THE RESIDENTIAL DISTRICT, THE C-1 AND C-2 ZONES, AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GENESSEE, IDAHO: SECTION 1. AMENDMENT THAT SECTION 10-4-1 of the City Code of Genesee, Idaho, be, and the same hereby is, amended so as to add additional requirements for mobile homes on individual lots as follows: (D) Requirements for Mobile Homes On Individual Lots. (1) Mobile homes on individual lots shall conform to all requirements of conventionally built homes on individual lots. (2) Wheels shall be removed, the mobile home shall be supported by concrete pillars or blocks placed on concrete pads which measure a minimum of 16" x 16". Fireproof skirting shall be installed within 60 days moved, or covered so as to be pleasing to the eye. Storage under mobile home will not be allowed. (3) Mobile homes shall be connected to and served by the same utility systems as provide service to conventionally-built residences and shall contain certain heating, plumbing illumination, cooking and electrical equipment and installations which conform to the standards adopted by the City of Genesee for conventionally-built residences within the City. (4) Within the residential district, the C-1 and C-2 zones, the mobile homes shall not be permitted that pose a hazard or detriment to existing neighboring housing due to deficient construction or maintenance. (5) Building permits shall be issued only to those mobile homes meeting all of the specifications of the United States of America Standards Institute—Standards for Mobile Homes 1977 Edition (and subsequent editions). Section 2. Effective Date. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon publication following passage and approval.
