**Facts About the Grange—
 Grange Is an American Organization**

E. W. White of Kendrick, Master of Kendrick Grange, said local Grange members are making plans which will include activities for the entire community. He said the purpose of Grange Week is to give everyone an opportunity to learn more about the Grange organizations, its activities and members.

The Grange organization is strictly American. It originated here — was developed here and America is the only country to have such an organization. It was originated in 1876 by 7 founding fathers, led by Oliver Hudson Kelly, in his office at 4½ Street, Washington, D. C. It grew from this small office to reach the length and breadth of the country.

The National Grange are now the proud owners of their building in Washington, D. C. located just around the corner from the White House. The Mortgage Burning Ceremony for this building was held there and across the nation on March 25, 1977.

The Grange is a rural-urban organization. Its policies and program are generated by total community and national interest—Not by Agricultural interest alone.

It is the only Farm Fraternity in the world and the only fraternity that includes the entire family—men, women and children.

The Grange is a Community service organization, a voice for the people, a source of education, a legislative force, and yet supplies social and recreational activities for members of all ages and groups.

The Grange cooperates to the fullest extent with churches, schools, and all other civic organizations. Varied programs covering local, county, state and National problems are carried out.

There is something here for all ages and members of the family. Trees in Latah County Will Be Increased

The trees in Latah County will be increased by nearly 60,000 from the Clarke-McNary Nursery at the University of Idaho. 87 orders were submitted by the county residents. Orders were from 100 to 10,000 trees. The nursery will mail cards to people who ordered and will assign a day to pick them up at the Moscow storage shed.

Trees are used for windbreaks, forest plantings and Christmas trees. This year should be a much better year than 1977. Gordon Dalley, County Agent, cautions growers to take good care of trees and plant as soon as possible. Tree roots that are allowed to dry are killed before planting and the customer is disappointed because of carelessness.

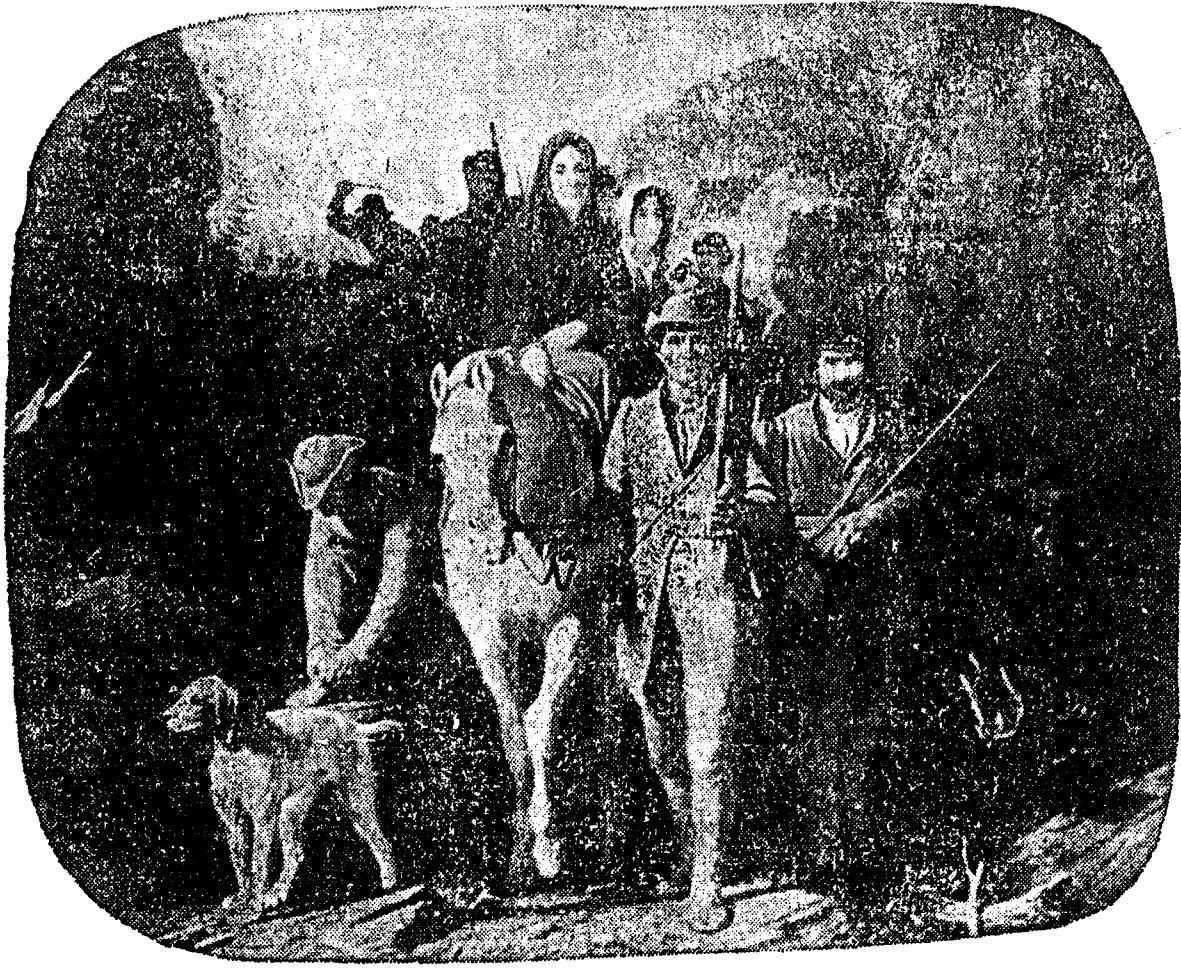

Current totals are: Moscow, 149 compared to 163 last week and 263 in 1977; Genesee, 9, 11, 7; Troy-Deary-Bovill 178, 173, 230; Kendrick 6, 7, 14; and Pottlatch 68, 85, and 102. The decrease in the claim total is attributable to warmer weather which permitted some loggers to return to work.


