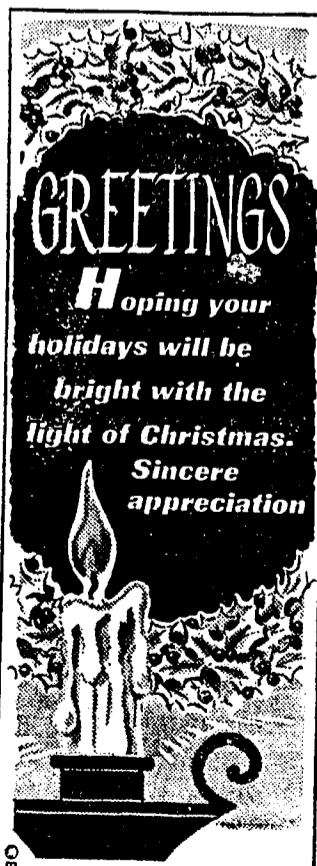

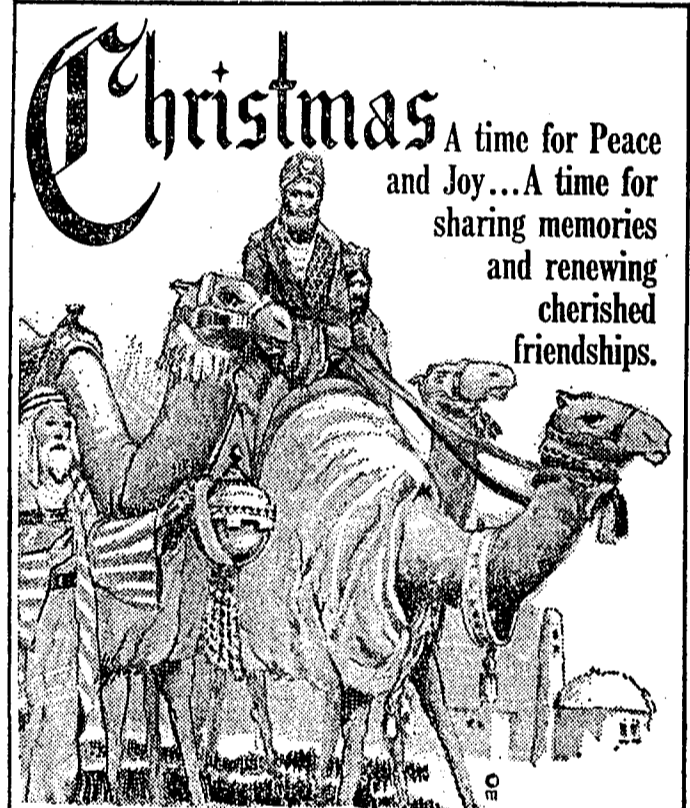



**4-HE'S HELP BOOST CONSUMPTION OF LAMB: AN INTERNATIONAL FAVORITE**

Chicago—From spicy East Indian curries to flavorful Greek moussaka, lamb dishes are popular around the world.

One of the most versatile of meats, lamb can show up on the table as special gourmet fare or as a simple main dish for everyday meals. Mini lamb loaves—a delicious departure from the standard meat loaf—fall into the latter category. They're easy to prepare and economical, too.

**Mini Lamb Loaves**

2 pounds ground lamb  
1 pkg. onion soup mix  
1 cup evaporated milk  
one-third ounces cheddar cheese, cut in 1/2-inch cubes  
1 can (10 1/2 oz) cheddar cheese soup  
1 tsp. Worcestershire sauce  
1/2 cup milk

Combine the lamb, onion soup mix, milk and bread crumbs. Refrigerate until ready to use. Spoon some of the lamb mixture into each of 12 compartments of a muffin tin, filling each about half full. Place a piece of cheese on each portion of lamb. Using the rest of the meat mixture, fill the muffin tin compartments, mounding each slightly above the top of pan. Bake at 375 degrees for about 20 to 25 minutes. Remove from pan to serve.

Meanwhile, combine cheese soup, milk and Worcestershire sauce in a saucepan. Heat and serve over the lamb loaves. Makes 6 servings.



**Family**  
Anxiety and Early Life Consequences

Which is not to say that the child who is born into a family where the father is a doctor and the mother is a nurse will be a doctor and nurse. It is probably true that the child will be more likely to become a doctor or nurse than a child born into a family where the father is a farmer and the mother is a housewife.

Anxiety is a normal part of life. We mean an anxiety that is not pathological. Some of the effects of anxiety are sadness, elation and a sense of euphoria. Anxiety is a state of mind that is unwilling or unable to satisfy the need.

Because of the helplessness of a young child, he can only partially relieve himself of these tensions and gratify his needs and so is under the necessity of being at the mercy of other humans in accomplishing this end.

But parental attitudes of letting children "cry it out" too often and too long is bad; it requires the child to deal with too much pain and loneliness by himself, and he fails to develop that most necessary mental and emotional function of being able to relate to and use the warmth and friendliness of others. These attitudes on the part of the parents tend to give children the impression that they are alone in the world, that they are likely to be neglected, that their needs will probably not be met anyway. The baffling lack of emotional response and depression in a schizo-

phrenic person is undoubtedly due to the fact that he has been denied the love and attention of his parents who do not know how to be successful or how to get along in the world. The child's sense of direction in life is probably the result of the lack of attention of his parents.

As the child continues to grow, his mind continues to seek gratification. If any of these are gratified, the child will feel that he has a sense of direction. If he does not, he would feel that he is lost. He would not be able to satisfy his need because of lack of love or punishment. To keep him from feeling that way, the parent is a constant in his mind. Anxiety is not confined to the mind. Anxiety is an overall sensation and is felt in the body as well as the mind. To keep anxiety at a minimum, in each individual, the infant should have love, affection, interest, attention and fondling by a close contact with devoted parents, should not be allowed to be hungry too long and should be allowed the satisfac-

tion of suckling. If these needs are frustrated, the child's development may be retarded or he may retain more emotional tension. A particular stage of development is normal. We should not say that the baby will be spoiled by too much love. Overindulgence or spoiling is not dangerous if the parent can meet the child's requirements. Moreover, the question of spoiling is not as important as the question of months of development as it may be during later years. On the contrary, the more the child experiences affection and understanding of his own needs, the easier it will be his later responses to family demands and the progress of his socialization.

Reading the papers these days, it would seem that our future depends upon well-planned, well-constructed, and well-launched rockets and satellites. Does it not depend more upon well-constructed and well-launched personalities? The first year or two of personality development, contains many variables. Father is important to the child in the first year of life. But, he is important in two different applications of himself. First, what he does directly for the child by feeding, taking care and playing with him, and second, how he makes mother happy, contented and aware of the importance of the job she is



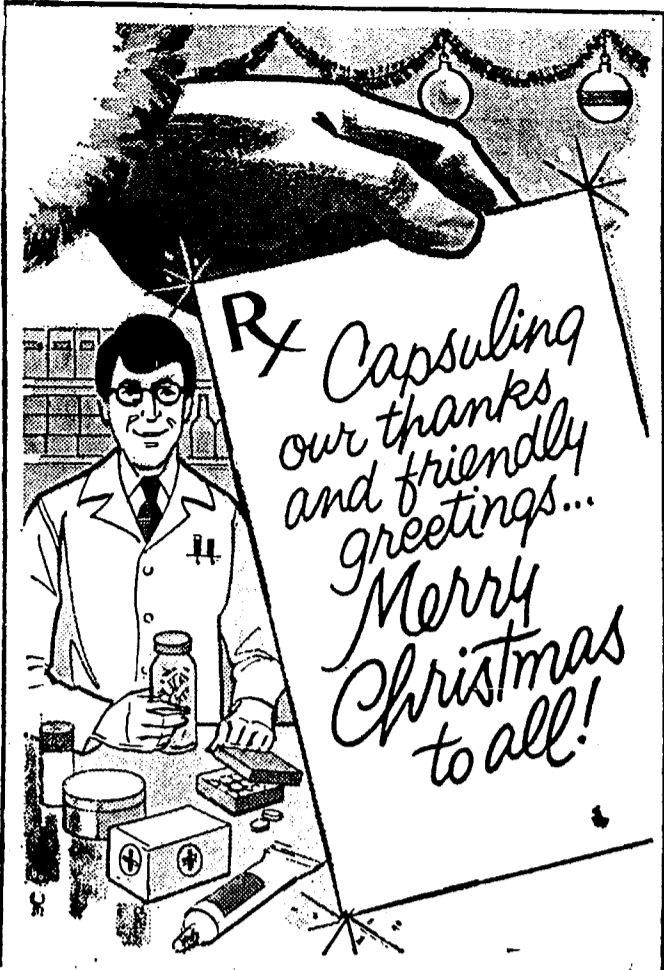
