Picnic Food Safety

How do most Americans spell summer? "P-I-C-N-I-C". But unless food is properly handled, reminds consultant Jean Burkhardt of the Idaho Dairy Council, picnickers may suffer from food illness or food poisoning. Summertime "flu bugs" are often "picnic-itis" in reality. When it's picnic time, keep in mind the following:

Foods requiring refrigeration must be kept safe for consumption. Keep all perishable foods below 40 degrees F. until they are served. Adequate refrigeration keeps bacteria and toxins from multiplying in food.

Milk and meat products and raw meats to be barbecued at the picnic are all especially delicate, so never let them get warm. If you must travel for a length of time to the travel site and cannot properly refrigerate your perishable in coolers, it is best to wait to buy milk or luncheon meat as near to the site as possible.

As soon as you arrive, remove all food from the car (a warm car is no place to store a cooler!) and place it in the shade. Try to place it away from the ants and any other uninvited critters, too!

Undercooking meats and poultry is highly likely when an exuberant chef is rushed or cooking for large groups. The simple solution is to use a lower heat or spread the coals out. Longer, slower cooking on a

barbecue ensures juicier meats and poultry, plus reduces the likelihood of bacteria left in food.

Now that uncurd processed meats are available, they pose a potential health problem. Be extra cautious to keep them cold at all times. Four to seven days is the longest they keep safely in the refrigerator, far from the two to three weeks cured franks or luncheon meats will keep. When serving, try to set perishable foods in a bed of ice. Don't leave foods like salads out on the table for long periods. Try to get the picnickers to eat together so that cold foods will be cold and hot foods hot. That's the safest and the most enjoyable way to share outdoor meals.

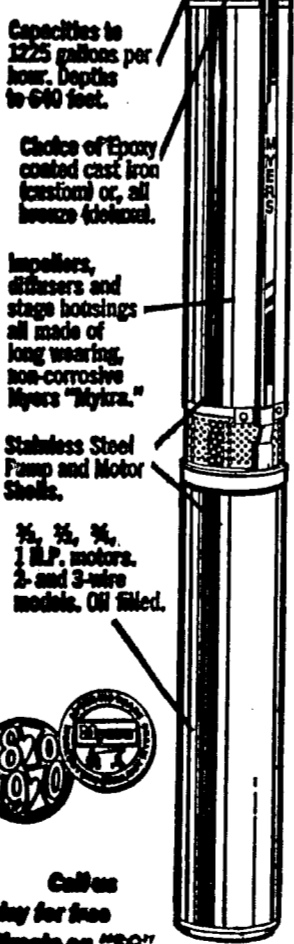


