Nine Dairy Aerosols Being Recalled

Moscow - Nine pyrethrin-containing insecticides packaged in aerosol containers and marketed in at least 31 states for insect control in dairy barns are the subject of an extensive recall program because of a potential container rupture problem.

The recall was initiated by Speer Products, Inc., a division of Shilo, Inc., of Memphis, Tenn. The products were formulated and packaged by Speer Products and distributed by AID Laboratories of Okeechobee, Fla., and by Hess and Clark of Ashland, Ohio.

The Dow Chemical Co., a supplier of one of the aerosol components, is conducting the recall program for Speer. Due to the wide distribution, Dow has assembled and will direct field teams to retrieve the aerosol cans in accordance with the company's product stewardship commitment.

According to R. W. Charlton, public relations manager for agricultural products at Dow, some containers have ruptured in warehouses. "No injuries have been caused that we're aware," said Charlton, "and we can't identify any property damage that has occurred."

The insecticides, packaged in 36-oz. aerosol containers, are sold under the following labels: AID Dairy Aerosol, Hubbard Dairy Aerosol, COOP Dairy Aerosol, Kent Dairy Aerosol, Pyrethone Dairy Aerosol, Golden Sun Aerosol Fly Killer, Della-Mist Aerosol, Supersweet Dairy Aerosol, and GTA Feeds Buy-a-Boo Dairy Aer-

osol.

According to UI entomologist Gene P. Carpenter, three of these products are known to be distributed in Idaho: Pyrethone (put out by the Hess and Clark division of Rhone-Poulenc), Della-Mist (DeLaval Separator Co.), and Bug-a-Boo (Farmers Union Grain Terminal Association).

Dairy farmers are others possessing the products are urged to call by collect telephone 901/767-0056 in Memphis. A retrieval team will pick up the product and reimburse the dairy farmer, retailer distributor.

Representatives of Speer are warning farmers not to destroy or attempt to use the aerosol insecticide cans, but rather to call the above number. The products should be isolated and should not be unnecessarily moved or agitated.

Speer officials indicate the insecticide container problem could be related to the current heat wave. However the cause of those problems is still under investigation. Speer representatives say the potential for human injury and property damage from rupturing cans requires immediate recall, even though the exact cause of the problem may not be determined for some time.

WELL-NOURISHED CATTLE PRODUCE MORE CALVES

Ithaca, N. Y.—Adequate nutrition is the key to high calf crop percentages in cattle herds, a UI researcher reported at the American Society of Animal Science meeting here July 30.

Dr. R. Garth Sasser said reproductive performance was poor in Hereford heifers which received a diet deficient in crude protein during the last 150 days of pregnancy and the first 110 days after calving.

When first-calf heifers were fed adequate levels of protein, they were rebred sooner and with a more favorable rate of conception, Sasser said.

Participating in the UI research project with Sasser were R. J. Williams, Carla Ruder, D. G. Falk and Dr. Richard C. Bull.

STRONG TOWER SUPPORTS WINDMILL POWER SYSTEM

Moscow—The windmill tower is a key element of any wind energy system for generating electricity, according to energy experts.

A report from Idaho's Energy-Efficiency Project states that "in most cases, towers should extend 30 feet above the nearest obstruction and be strong enough to withstand weight of the wind machine and the force imposed by the strongest winds."

The energy project conducts educational programs on behalf of the Idaho Office of Energy and the UI Cooperative Extension Service. The project's recommendations regarding wind power and other alternative energy sources are available from county offices of the UI Cooperative Extension Service.


