### LEGAL NOTICE

ORDINANCE NO. 258  
AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF GENESEE, IDAHO, AMENDING TITLE TEN, CHAPTER EIGHT, SECTION FIVE OF THE CITY CODE OF GENESEE, IDAHO, BY ADDING THERETO PART (E) PROVIDING PERFORMANCE STANDARDS FOR THE BACKFILLING OF ALL EXCAVATIONS IN THE STREETS OF THE CITY OF GENESEE, AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GENESEE, IDAHO:

SECTION 1. That section 10-8-5 of the City Code of Genesee, be and the same hereby is, amended by the addition to said section of the following part E:

(E) Backfilling excavations in streets and alleys.

1. All excavations in the streets of the City of Genesee will be backfilled in the following manner:

(a) Excavation of three (3) feet or less will be backfilled to grade with crushed rock, three-fourths (3/4) inch minus, where the excavation is in the traffic bearing portion of the street. See No. 3, a, or b, for excavations not in the traffic bearing portion of the street.

(b) Excavations over three (3) feet in depth will be backfilled with six (6) inch lifts of soil to within a three (3) foot depth of the surface of the street for that part which is in the traffic bearing portion of the street. Each six (6) inch lift will be compacted to ninety-five percent (95%) of standard proctor density. The moisture content of the backfill material shall be satisfactory to the City Supervisor or not more than three (3) percentage points above or below optimum moisture as determined by ASTM testing. The remaining three (3) feet of excavation will be backfilled to grade as required in 1, a, except for that portion of a paved street which will be finished as stated in No. 2. Non-traffic bearing excavation of the street will be backfilled as stated in No. 3, a or b, whichever is appropriate.

2. Excavations in paved streets will be backfilled as stated in 1, a, or 1, b, whichever is appropriate, except for the oil mat which will be finished to grade with a hot mix of oil of not less than two (2) inches of compacted thickness. The oil mat replacement will be equal to or will exceed the thickness of the existing oil mat.

3.

(a) Excavation in alleys on the non-traffic bearing portions of streets, having excavations over two (2) feet in depth, will be backfilled by twelve (12) inch lifts of soil having a moisture content between eighteen (18) and twenty (20) percent. Each lift will be compacted with four passes of an appropriate compactor to within two (2) feet of the surface. The remaining two (2) feet will then be backfilled with crushed gravel, three-fourths (3/4) inch minus, to the surface of the alley or the non-traffic bearing portion of the street.

(b) Excavation in alleys or the non-traffic bearing portions of streets two (2) feet or less will be backfilled to the surface with crushed gravel, three-fourths (3/4) inch minus.

4. The party or parties requesting any excavation will agree to incur all costs that are involved in the excavation and back-filling procedure as outlined above except if the work to be done is contracted by the City of Genesee for the City of Genesee.

5. No excavations in City streets or alleys will be performed unless of an emergency nature, if the moisture content of the back-fill material (soil) cannot be maintained between eighteen (18) and twenty (20) percent.

6. All work will be done under the supervision and inspection of authorized personnel of the City of Genesee.

SECTION 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage, approval and publication as required by law of the State of Idaho.

**New Regulations Affecting Cattle Began In July**

Regulations affecting cattle beginning July 1, 1980 are passed along to county agent Gordon Daley by Geo. Oakshot, U. S. D. A. Veterinarian Services in Lewiston.

- 1) All Idaho female cattle born after July 1, 1980 must be official Brucellosis Vaccinates to be eligible for resale to Idaho ranches.
- 2) A non-vaccinated Idaho cow will be eligible for sale to return to an Idaho ranch for the life of that animal, provided she was born before July 1, 1980.
- 3) A change of ownership Brucellosis Test is generally required on all Idaho cattle over the age of 24 mo.
- 4) Effective July 1, 1980, any cow sold and imported from another state to an Idaho ranch, must be an Official Brucellosis Vaccinate.
- 5) As the regulation now stands, any cow moving on a seasonal grazing permit from out of state into Idaho will continue to be able to enter on a permit until July 1, 1982. After that date, only official Brucellosis Vaccinates, that have been Brucellosis Tested Negative within the preceding 12 months, will be permitted to enter Idaho.

#### Ash Victims May Have Tax Deductible Loss

Boise — Ash from the eruption of Mt. St. Helens has created many problems for residents in affected areas. One of the questions many people are asking of the Internal Revenue Service is, "Can I take a Federal income tax deduction for the cost of repairing damage to my automobile which resulted from driving in ash-laden areas?"

According to the Internal Revenue Service, the answer to that question depends on several factors. "The deductibility of these losses will be made on a case-by-case basis," said Aubry Myrick, Acting IRS District Director, "according to how and when the damage occurred."

The costs of repairing a car or cleaning up after a casualty are not deductible as a casualty loss. What may be deductible will be the smaller of the decrease in fair market value of the adjusted basis of the property, less any insurance proceeds.

Fair market value (FMV) is the amount a willing buyer would pay a willing seller. Most property is acquired by purchase and its basis is its cost.

The costs of repairs or cleanup may be used as a measure of the decrease in FMV if: (1) necessary to restore the property to its condition before the casualty, (2) repair amounts are not excessive, (3) they take care of no more than the damage suffered and (4) the value of the property is no more than its value before the casualty.

Losses on property used solely for personal purposes are deductible to the extent they exceed \$100. Business

property losses are deductible in full without regard to the \$100 limitation.

A casualty loss is the complete or partial destruction of property from an identifiable event that is damaging to property, and sudden or unexpected in nature. If a taxpayer were driving during the initial eruption and were caught in the ash fallout, the damage to the auto could be a casualty loss.

Damage caused by your willful act or negligence or that of a person acting for you is not deductible as a casualty loss. If the taxpayer did not live in the fallout area and deliberately drove into the area after being warned of the potential hazards, the resulting damage would not be a deductible casualty loss.

It will also be considered as willful negligence, if normal driving habits were continued without taking the

#### NEW PROTEIN MAY REVEAL PREGNANCY IN CATTLE

 Ithaca, N. Y.—University of Idaho Researchers have isolated a new protein which may aid detection of early pregnancy in cattle, the American Society of Animal Science was told July 29.

J. E. Butler, UI graduate student in animal science, reported on the procedures researchers followed as they isolated two proteins from placental membranes of pregnant cows.

One of the proteins, identified as alpha fetoprotein, may prove to be useful for preventing abortions in cattle which are deficient in this pregnancy-associated protein, Butler suggested.

The other protein was apparently isolated for the first time. Butler said further research will be needed to determine if testing for this protein might enable cattlemen to detect pregnancy in cattle soon after conception occurs.

In addition to Butler, the UI research team included Carla Ruder, R. J. Williams, Dr. R. G. Sasser and Dr. G. M. Hass

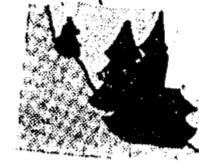

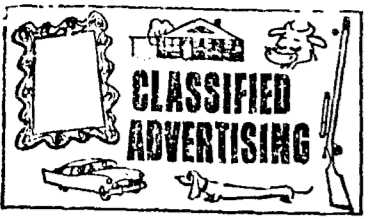
