### BOATING PROGRAMS AT DWORSHAK

Safe boating is the theme for this week's activities at Dworshak Reservoir August 23rd and 24th. Two entertaining films will be shown on request at the Visitor Center. "The National Safe Boating Test" guides each viewer through a series of 20 boating situations, presenting various alternative solutions. The participant then has to decide what is the right thing to do, select the answer and find out the result. Have you ever wondered how you would get to safety or shore if your boat pilot were injured? The 15-minute film "Suddenly in Command" explains what should be done when an operator is suddenly unable to run the boat.

At 1:00 p. m. Sunday, Corps of Engineers summer patrol rangers will give a presentation showing recreationists that a boat doesn't have to be fancy to be safe. They'll also tell how to deal with fire and other potentially hazardous situations on board. A demonstration of the patrol boat's fire-fighting pumps will conclude the half-hour program. Water safety buttons, coloring books and decals will be handed out throughout the day. Dworshak project personnel hope you will join us for this weekend's Sunday Special.

### WOODWORKING AND MECHANICS OFFERED

Moscow How to make a small project of wood or do a minor tune up on a balky car are skills to be taught in University of Idaho Continuing Education classes this fall.

Steve Gulbrandsen will teach basic woodworking and fabrication, covering wood identification, measurements, machine tool terminology, operation and safety as well as joint fabrication and making a small project. Materials for exercises are supplied but students will supply material for the small project. The class meets Thursdays from 7 to 10 p. m. Sept. 11 through Dec. 11. The fee is \$40.

Car mechanics, stressing emergency repairs and maintenance, will be taught by John Drew. Items to be covered include minor tune-ups, fuel filter and fan belt replacement and battery care. The class will be offered in two concurrent sessions, one meeting from 7 to 8 p. m. and one from 8 to 9 p. m. each Tuesday, Sept. 9 through Oct. 14. The fee is \$20.

Private pilot ground school will be offered through Continuing Education again this fall. The time, dates and place will be announced later.

**How We Choose a Mate Interests New Faculty Member**

Moscow—Why people choose to marry a particular individual and how family background influence the choice are questions of particular interest to the University of Idaho's new male home economics instructor, Dr. Charles Ainsworth, who expects to complete work soon at WSU for a Ph. D. degree in sociology with emphasis on the family has researched the reasons behind mate selection choices.  
He said the study of mate selection or how people get together is complex in his country. "There is freedom of choice with little parental control" and little regulation from outside the family."  
His work is conducted by interviewing people—anyone with a commitment to another person. Young people are willing to talk, some are even anxious to talk about the reasons for their choice," Ainsworth said.  
Family backgrounds and relationships with parents have a great deal to do with what people look for in a spouse. "There is no training agency for the mate selection process. I'm working on the premise that people have to go back to family values and adopt them, not completely, but in some important areas."  
Ainsworth said there is more attention being focused on the family unit and its problems now than was formerly true.  
"Help is available to families with problems but attention is also being given to the good families too, to help them get better. I think this is needed because of the pressures brought to bear on families by our type of society."  
"It (society) does nothing to help families stay together. If anything, our society tears the family apart."

Agencies are helping with this. "A crucial question in the area of family relations is whether some problems families have result from our type of society, from the choice made in selecting a mate or because of both," Ainsworth said.  
Ainsworth will teach half-time at UI this year with the rank of visiting assistant professor. He will teach childhood through adolescence, contemporary family relations, and a graduate course in parent-child relations in the spring.  
His previous teaching experience includes 10 years at the University of Montevallo, Montevallo, Alabama, a total of six years as a teaching assistant, including last year at WSU and public and religious school experience at the 5th grade level.  
He said he hasn't taught child development classes before, but has taught a number of family relations courses, as well as several classes in the fields of sociology and anthropology.

Ainsworth was born in Louisiana and holds a B. A. degree in social science and an M. A. degree in sociology from Northwestern State College, Natchitoches, La., an M. A. degree in anthropology from the University of Alabama, an Ed. D. degree from the University of Sarasota, Sarasota, Fla., has completed course for a Ph. D. degree in sociology from UA, and did post doctoral study at Brigham Young University in Utah. He and his wife, Winnie, and three children live in Moscow.



**RUSH STARTS**

Moscow—About 600 University of Idaho students are expected to arrive to campus early to participate in sorority and fraternity rush activities.  
Bruce Pitman, assistant dean for Student Advisory Services, said 247 women are registered for sorority rush which began Friday, Aug. 5. "This is almost exactly the same number as last year," he said. "Sorority housing will be tight, with some pledges probably staying in the dormitories for the first semester." For the past two years, the UI sororities have had more pledges than they could accommodate fall semester, moving women to the houses from the dormitories as vacancies occur.  
After visits and parties with the houses, the rushees will learn where they will have an opportunity to pledge during traditional "sneak day" activities on the Administration Building lawn at 2 p. m. Wed., Aug. 20.  
Fraternity rush begins that same day with orientation for an expected 310 to 350 men.  
Pitman said fraternities should reach 94 to 95 percent of capacity, with the number of men going through "about average for the past ten years."  
Men's rush activities end Sunday evening, August 24.

Moscow—The University of Idaho chapter of Phi Delta Theta social fraternity has been presented the Silver Star award by the fraternities national organization.  
The award is given chapters in recognition of outstanding scholarship, finances, community service activities, pledge education programs and cooperation with the General Fraternity in reporting and overall chapter operation. The award was given to only six other chapters in the nation.


