Early-Day Juliaetta Physician's Story Featured In "Latah Legacy" Magazine

The story of Dr. Robert Foster and his "School of Healing" is featured in the current issue of "Latah Legacy," the quarterly magazine published by the Latah County Historical Society. Dr. Foster was an in-fluential and sometimes controversial figure in the history and development of Juliaetta and surrounding area from 1903 until 1909. The story was researched and written by Caroline Gravelle of Juliaetta.

Mrs. Gravelle traces Foster's life from his first discovery of his own gift to help people, to his final years in Clarkston, Washington where he had moved his practice after leaving Juliaetta. She obtained her infor-mation from early newspapers, oral history tapes, interviews with local people who remembered Foster and largely from Mrs. Mel Thomas, of Lewiston, who is the only surviving child of the late physician. Foster's hospital was located in the building next to Ted's Arco station. It is now the home of Mrs. R. H. Hamilton.

The magazine is now on sale at Abrams Hardware and Phil's Food City in Genesee and at the Juliaetta Library and the Juliaetta Market.
