**CAP Rewards Total \$850**

Rewards for information leading to arrests for fish and game law violations total \$850 and several reports are being investigated by Department of Fish and Game conservation officers according to a spokesman for CAP—Citizens Against Poaching.

Dale Baird, CAP coordinator, also announced that the organization's board of directors has been formed following the selection of a representative from each of the department's six regions.

They are Lillian Velma Gaine, Coeur d'Alene; Greg Charlton, Lewiston; Dennis Gratton, Boise; Phil Smith, Buhl; Greg Mang, Pocatello, and Frank Lawyer, Idaho Falls.

CAP was organized last January to give citizens an opportunity to assist in a program to combat the theft of fish and wildlife. The reward fund, financed by private contributions now totals about \$4,000 and CAP officials are actively seeking donations from business firms, sports organizations and individuals. No state funds are involved.

A \$10 contribution entitles an individual to a wallet-size membership card, a bumper sticker and a decal and single bumper stickers can be purchased for one dollar each.

All contributions are tax deductible, Baird said, and they should be addressed to Citizens Against Poaching, P. O. Box 7533, Boise, Id 83707.

A person who wishes to report a possible fish and game law violation may dial a toll-free number—1-800-632-5999—and his or her identity will be absolutely protected, Baird said.

**Immunizations Required for School Age Children**

Immunizations are recommended for your child. The Immunization Law reads that any child in Kindergarten through the Fifth Grade shall have proof of immunization provided to the school.

The proof of immunization shall be a statement which gives the month, day and year of the immunization. The required immunizations are:

DPT—4 or more.  
 Polio: 4 or more.  
 Measles: 1 given after the child is 12 months of age.  
 Mumps: 1 given after the child is 12 months of age.  
 Rubella: 1 given after the child is 12 months of age.

Exceptions are available for personal, religious or health reasons. Parents may sign an exemption form by contacting the school.

Immunizations are available from the Latah Co. Office of the North Central District Health Department. The clinics are held in Room 130 of the County Courthouse from 1:30 to 4:30 on the 1st and 3rd Wednesdays of each month. No appointment is necessary. Immunizations may also be obtained from your private physician.

It is recommended that a physical examination be obtained for children entering Kindergarten or the Fifth Grade. This is to ensure that school children are free from health problems that would prevent them from doing their best in school. These physicals can be obtained from your family doctor.

Call 882-7506 if you have questions about your child's immunizations. The next Immunization Clinic will be held June 17, 1981.

**Genesee People  
Return from  
Far East Trip**

Representative and Mrs. Tom Boyd, Genesee, and Senator and Mrs. Mike Mitchell, Lewiston, were guests, as were many other representatives from other states May 12 for a week in Taiwan, Republic of China. The delegates, given very preferential treatment by the Taiwanese, were assigned a guide, escorted to and from meetings and treated to air fare, lodging and meals while touring the country and attending trade meetings.

Leaving Genesee on May 8th, the group flew from Spokane to Los Angeles and directly to Taipei on a thirteen hour flight. They did much sightseeing, enjoying the Imperial Museum, the National Revolutionary Martyr's Shrine, located in the center of Taipei and the Taiwan Handicraft Promotion Center. The president of the Chinese Classical Arts Co. which is a company making famous Chinese porcelain. They browsed through the Farmers' Market, where food is sold in the open, toured farms, canning factories and saw the huge "silos" or grain elevators in the port. They shopped at the Far East, Taipei's largest department store and toured a pottery factory. Mrs. Boyd noted that the city has a very severe smog problem, because of the concentrated industry and the climate is humid and tropical, with rain every day. Boyd noted that the military was very much in evidence and they were escorted by armed guards, with an undercover person, like our Secret Service, on the buses with them. After Pope John Paul was shot, the security tightened.

A special happening for Tom and Bev was being entertained in the home of Jane Ching's parents in Taipei. Jane is a Doctoral candidate at Washington State University this year and Dale and Barbara Carbin are the host family to Jane and another young Taiwanese student. The Chings were very kind to the Boyds, taking them around in their own car on a sightseeing tour.

Boyd and Mitchell felt the trip was a real "eye-opener," showing the Americans how our nation can do business with this country and vice versa. 18,000,000 people live on this island, about the size of our state of Maryland and they need our wheat. Boyd would like to see our former Idaho Department of Commerce and Economic Development reactivated, so that we could once again have a foreign trade specialist working for the state. At a livestock farm, methane gas was being produced from hog manure and an experimental car was operating on the methane. They are working at perfecting this, Tom stated.

The Boyds spent three days in Hong Kong and were most impressed by the beauty of this city. They did see the Boat People and noted the contrast in their life style to the high rise apartment houses in Hong Kong. They rode the "Huller," a

fast commuter train up through Japan and were most impressed by the 150-mile per hour speed. Tom noted at Civic Association that he and Beverly and the Mitchells had 13 pieces of luggage between them and it was a real art to get it transferred from one train to another, as it only stops for 1 1/2 minutes at each station!

They visited the World's Fair, Port of Fuzhou in Fuzhou, China, and Hiroshima and noted that they had Japanese speak English. They visited both a Shinto and a Buddhist temple and were impressed with the traditional dress of the Japanese women. Many wore the Kimono and some with their hair arranged with combs and needles. They saw the "Huller" or Imperial Palace of Japan and rode the "Huller" to Taipei. From Taipei they flew home, arriving May 22nd.


