 Some "truisms" fade with time. But not this one. In fact, it's as appropriate now, while we're besieged by a flurry of food fads—as it was a thousand years ago.

because March is National Nutrition Month—the time of year the American Dietetic Association goes all out to remind us of the vital role nutrition plays in fostering fitness and health.

It's also a time to ponder how well you eat or, if you will, how wise you are.

#### STATE REP. MARGUERITE P. McLAUGHLIN APPOINTED

State Representative Marguerite McLaughlin has been appointed by Governor John V. Evans to serve on the newly formed State Advisory Council that will advise and assist in implementing the Education Consolidation and Improvement Act of 1981. The appointment is for 3 years.

Chapter two of the Act consolidates many elementary and secondary programs into a single State Grant and several other programs into a discretionary fund.

To participate a State must submit to the Secretary of Education a three (3) year application which may be updated annually.

From the total amount of funds received in each state, not less than 80% must be allocated to local education agencies and up to 20% may be reserved for state administration of the program.

Higher per pupil allocations must be provided to local educational agencies with the greatest numbers of percentages of children whose education imposes higher than average costs, (low income families), economically depressed areas and in sparsely populated areas.

Mrs. McLaughlin previously served on the Board of Trustees of Joint School District No. 171.

#### UPLAND GAME SURVEY RETURNS NEEDED

The Department of Fish and Game needs more returns from its annual survey of license holders who hunted upland game and migratory birds last year.

"We need as many of the report cards as possible, because the information helps us formulate recommendations for 1982 seasons, bag limits and other regulations that are considered by the Fish and Game Commission," said Dick Norell, state game bird manager.

"A cutoff date for returns must be set before too long so we can compile the results," he added.

About five percent—13,543—of resident and nonresident license holders received the postpaid cards, which ask how many of each species were harvested, how many hunting trips were involved and the counties in which the person hunted.

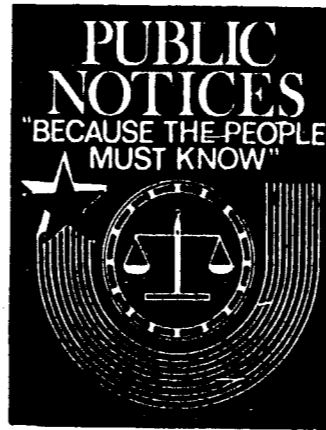

- Milk Group:**
  - \* Children: 3 cups or equivalent;
  - \* Teenagers: 4;
  - \* Adults: 2;
  - \* Pregnant women: 4;
  - \* Lactating women: 4.
- Meat Group:**
  - \* Children: 2 two-ounce servings of meat (or equivalent)
  - \* Teenagers: 2;
  - \* Adults: 2;
  - \* Pregnant women: 3;
  - \* Lactating women: 2.
- Fruits and Vegetable Group**
  - \* All: 4 servings.
- Grain Group**
  - \* All: 4 servings.

**SCOLIOSIS SCREENING TO BE CONDUCTED IN AREA SCHOOLS**

Public Health Nurses from the North Central District Health Department will be conducting scoliosis screening in area schools, other than Moscow, during March and April. Scoliosis, or curvature of the spine, is a condition which may develop during a rapid growth spurt of the teen years. Most of the time the cause is unknown.

The scoliosis screening is a very simple process and will be for 6th, 7th, 8th and 9th grade students. Observation of the students may include the following points:

1. Difference in shoulder or shoulder blade height.
2. Prominence of either shoulder blade.
3. Prominence of either hip.
4. Prominence of one side of the rib cage.
5. Any side-to-side curve of the spine.

Early recognition of scoliosis and early treatment are important to ward off severe progression of the curve. The School Nurse will be showing a film on scoliosis screening about a week before the actual screening is carried out. Parents will be contacted if there is any abnormality noted.

If parents have any questions about the film or the screening they can contact the School Nurse at the Health Department at 882-7506.

**HEALTH AND WELFARE HAS PHONE FOR THE DEAF**

The Idaho Department of Health and Welfare has installed a telephone system for the deaf in its central office in Boise. The system, known as a TTY or TDD for Teletypewriter or Telecommunication Device for the Deaf, can be reached by dialing 334-4075 in Boise weekdays from 8 a. m. to 5 p. m. Mountain Time.

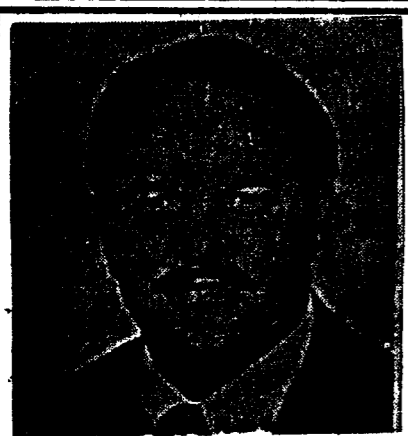
Collect calls to this number will be accepted from deaf persons in Idaho communities outside the Boise area, according to Judy Aitken, assistant affirmative action officer for the department.

In order to activate the device, which is located on the ninth floor of the State Office Tower, the deaf person must also have a TTY/TDD at his end of the line.

Messages are displayed on a small screen on the device. The department's TTY-TDD is also able to print out the messages on paper for a permanent record. Callers are informed, as required by law, when the printer is used. They may request that the call not be recorded.

Calls and messages from deaf persons needing any information or services from the department will be accepted at the 334-4075 number. If the deaf caller wishes to contact someone in one of the department's regional or field offices, for instance the message will be relayed to the proper person, as will the response back to the caller.

Aitken said that personnel at the 334-4075 number have been specially trained for communicating with the deaf and in dialing with some of the language barriers deaf persons may experience.

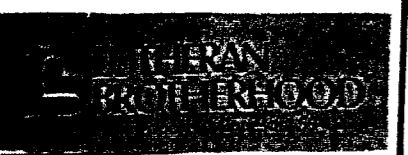
