**Herpes — The Epidemic Among Us**

They appear without warning they stay as long as they want; they leave without announcement. No one can avoid them. An estimated 15-20 million people in the United States suffer from genital herpes. Millions of others suffer from non-genital herpes. Both forms of infection can recur, be disruptive and highly contagious when sores are present.

Herpes simplex virus I, lesions are usually found on the lips, but sometimes around the eyes, nose and other body parts. The infection appears as groups of sores or blisters on the skin. They are sometimes known as cold sores or fever blisters. This form of herpes is most common among one-to-four-year olds.

A slightly different virus, Herpes simplex II, presents many of the same symptoms but is often contracted after one becomes sexually active. From three to twenty days after exposure to genital herpes blisters appear on infected areas. These blisters break open and become very painful. They may last two or more weeks and are often accompanied by swollen lymph glands, fever and aching muscles or joints. Although the blisters disappear the virus remains in the body.

Symptoms usually recur causing less severe discomfort than the initial outbreak.

Both forms of herpes are highly contagious just before and during an active outbreak. Infection is passed from person to person by exposure to the affected area either by kissing or oral-genital contact or other sexual contact.

The U. S. Food and Drug Administration recently announced approval of acyclovir ointment which has been demonstrated in tests to shorten outbreaks of genital herpes. While the medicine does not prevent or cure the disease, it is a significant step forward in dealing with a health problem for which there has been no treatment.

Individuals who suspect that they may be infected with herpes should get medical attention while they have the symptoms. Sometimes herpes can be confused with other diseases or health conditions. A pregnant woman with a history of herpes or symptoms of the disease should immediately notify her doctor. Herpes may be passed from the mother to the child during birth causing severe complications or even death.

**Historical Society Magazine Now on Sale**

Copies of the summer edition of Latah Legacy, the quarterly magazine of the Latah Co. Historical Society, are now available for sale.

This edition features two articles of particular interest to Kendrick area residents. One was written by Keith Williams a graduate student at Washington State University and is a historical study of the Charles and Mary Deobald family and their farm on American Ridge. Williams recounts the lifestyle of the Deobalds through oral history interviews with family members and by using artifacts and buildings remaining on the farmstead. A second article consists of oral history reminiscences taped in 1976 with long-time Latah County Commissioner Gerald Ingle of Big Bear Ridge who died in May. Ingle details the early days on the Ridge, his family and his involvement in county politics. The final article was written by Mary Reed and Carol Young and is entitled, "Rural Women of Latah County." In this piece, women's work as harvest and logging camp cooks is recounted. All articles are illustrated with historical photographs.
