

Fall Steelhead Season Open September 18

Idaho will have a fall steelhead season on the Salmon River and parts of the Snake and Clearwater starting September 18, following approval by the Fish and Game Commission (August 31).

On the Salmon, it will be catch-and-keep except for one stretch where special limit and gear restrictions protect wild steelhead returning to the Middle Fork Salmon according to John Coon, anadromous fishery manager, Department of Fish and Game.

The Clearwater system has a catch-and-release segment—most of it through October 15—to allow passage of wild steelhead among the "Group B" fish that migrate to those waters.

A September 18 opening is scheduled for the Snake from the interstate bridge at Lewiston to 150 yds. below Hells Canyon Dam. Coon has projected a run of at least 24,000 "Group A" steelhead bound for the Salmon. Fish passage over the dams on the Columbia River and Lower Snake "appears to be excellent," he said.

The Clearwater run, based on the return to Dworshak National Hatchery this spring, also looks to be strong, Coon said.

Here is a summary of seasons and regulations: Salmon River—September 18 through December 31 with a limit of two per day, four in possession and six per season. Boat fishing is prohibited between the mouth and Ahsahka highway bridge.

Snake River September 18 thru December 31 from the interstate bridge at Lewiston to 150 yards below Hells Canyon Dam, except that a stretch described in the regulations is closed around the Innah and Grande Ronde rivers to protect steelhead returning to the Oregon site. Limits are two, four and six.

From the interstate bridge a Lewiston down to the confluence of the Snake and Clearwater—October 16 through December 31 with limits of one fish daily, two in possession and three per season.

Steelhead tags purchased for the spring season are valid, Coon said.

The Social Security Administration (SSA) has announced plans for upgrading its computer operations. The importance of this undertaking becomes evident when viewed within the context of the job the system is required to perform.

SSA's automatic data processing operation maintains records on 240 million workers, 36 million Social Security beneficiaries, and 4.1 million supplemental security income recipients. In addition, each year it processes about 380 million wage reports from employers, 19 million transactions (such as change of address and earnings reports for persons already on the rolls) 7.5 million new applications for benefits, and 10

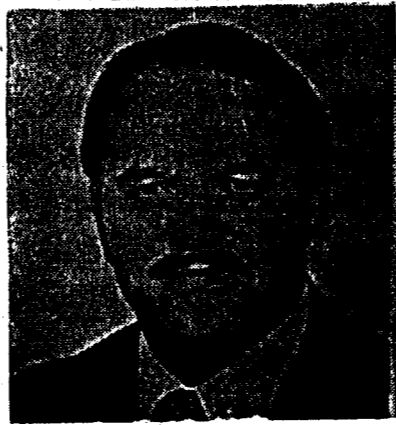

million requests for Social Security should be completed in a matter of days.

A modernized system will not only increase productivity, but reduce the number of erroneous payments and other actions as well.

In the past, efforts to improve the agency's data processing system have emphasized the purchase of more computers and the employment of more people. The result in parts has been a patch-work affair that is now being strained to the limit.

Once computer modernization becomes a reality, SSA will be able to keep individual earnings records more current. These records are the basis for determining entitlement to Social Security benefits and the amount of the benefits.

Similarly, new claims will be processed faster and with greater accuracy. Deficiencies in the current system often prevent prompt and accurate processing of applications for benefits. This, in turn, means that applicants frequently have to make repeat visits to local offices.

One specific example should illustrate the potential benefits of the modernization plan. Implementing the cost-of-living adjustment now requires 20,000 hours of processing over a 4-month period; once the upgraded system is in place, the job

Pears Should Be Picked When Green

Parma, Idaho—Pick pears when they are green, hard and mature size, says Michael Colt, horticulturist with the UI Cooperative Extension Service at Parma.

Colt says that, unlike apples, pears will develop a coarse, mealy texture if left on the tree to ripen. They will never reach peak flavor or texture.

Pick pears just after their color changes from dark-green to light green and the lenticels—small spots on the fruit's surface—have corked over. At this point, the flesh of the pear softens and fruit separates readily from the limb.

Be careful not to pull or twist when harvesting the pears. Lift the fruit until the stem separates easily from the tree. If the stem does not break readily, give the pear a few more days to mature.

According to Colt, summer pears like Bartlett and Bosc will ripen in a week if placed in a tightly closed plastic bag and stored in the basement at about 60 to 65 degrees.

They do not keep much more than a week under these conditions.

D'Anjou and other winter pears will ripen very slowly if kept in basement storage in plastic bags. To accelerate ripening of one of these late varieties, add one or two ripe apples to the bag. These will produce additional ethylene gas to speed the ripening process.

PERTUSSIS OUTBREAK REPORTED IN IDAHO

Idaho is currently experiencing an outbreak of a childhood disease known as pertussis, according to State Immunization Coordinator Bob Medlin. But information released earlier has located the epidemic on the wrong side of the state.

Seven cases of the disease, also known as whooping cough actually occurred in the Rexburg and Rigby areas with one case reported from Pocatello and two from Jerome. The children range in ages from five weeks to seven years with nine of the cases reported occurring in children under three years. Other cases are under investigation, Medlin said.

There has been some controversy recently concerning pertussis immunizations, Medlin said, "and some parents have refused to have their children receive the shots."

While adolescents and adults may contract pertussis, they usually have minimal effects, according to Medlin. But they may serve as carriers and infect children, for whom the disease represents a real danger.

"As many as 10 percent in fifteen percent of children under age three who have the disease die of it," Medlin said.
