KHS Track Team at Kamiah meet

The Kendrick High School track team competed in the Clearwater Valley Invitational Saturday, April 16, at Kamiah.

In the boys competition, Kendrick finished tenth among the thirteen schools entering squads. Kendrick's girls team placed third in over-all team scoring, paced by the three first place finishes of Kersten Jensen, and the first place win in the 800-meter relay.

Jensen again won the 100-meter with a personal best time of 12.4 seconds; the 200 meter with a time of 25.9.2 and the long jump with a leap of 19-9 1/2. The girls 800-meter relay team of Kersten Jensen, Kim Stonebraker, Marta Jensen and Lisa Mallem won that event in a time of 1:51 2.2.

In the photographs, Randy Benjamin (upper right) placed fourth in that event with a jump of 19-10 1/2. The event by won by Derrick Eggers of Deary with a season best of 22-2 1/2. Derrick is the son of Gary and Karen Eggers and the grandson of Mrs. Geo. Eggers of Juliaetta.

Kersten Jensen (upper left) breaks the tape first to win the 200-meter event with a time of 25.9. Kersten's younger sister Marta, finished fourth in the 200-meter.

Kersten also won the long jump with a distance of 19-9 1/2 (lower right), over two feet farther than the second place finisher.

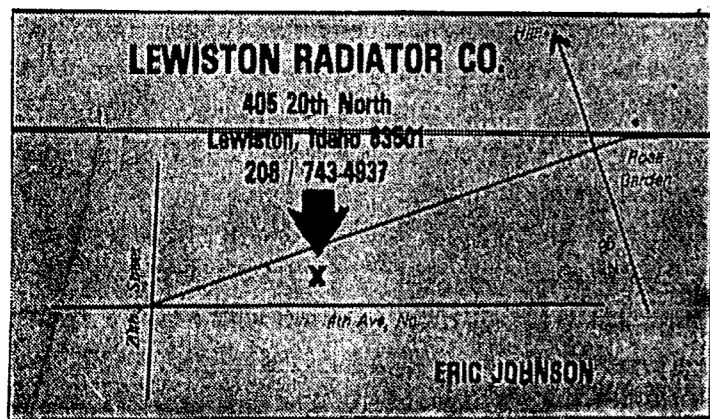

If you do not follow the action of the Kendrick track team, you probably do not know that Kendrick's own Kirsten Jensen is the top-ranked long jumper of Idaho. She is also ranked 8th in the whole United States. Kirsten reached this important milestone in her life by jumping an incredible 19 feet. This distance, when compared with boys' jumps would place her 3rd or 4th.
