

Gov. John Evans Proclaims June as "Dairy Month"

Governor John Evans has proclaimed June as "Dairy Month" in Idaho.

Speaking to a group of dairy people gathered in his office for the signing of the proclamation he stated that "since milk is nature's most

nearly perfect food, it follows that June is the most fitting month to celebrate "Dairy Month" since it is the start of summer when everyone appreciates the ease and convenience of the whole gamut of good dairy foods.

Governor Evans who also pointed out that "it was appropriate to pay tribute to the nation's vast dairy in-

dustry (one-fifth of the nation's farm economy) whose daily work and dedication contribute so much to the nation's health and prosperity every day of the year."

He encouraged all our citizens to enjoy milk and other dairy foods and urged civic and business organizations to cooperate in this observance in public and private.


