She was born Sept. 22, 1893, at Boise to John David and Eva Jane George. Living at Pearl until 1915, she then moved to the Eagle area, where she taught at Box Springs School from the fall of 1914 to the spring of 1915.

She had been educated at the Intermountain Institute at Weiser for 1½ years and Albion State Normal School at Albion for one year.

She married Raymond H. Cuddy at Pearl June 1, 1915. A farmer, all his life, Cuddy had been born at Southwick.

The couple lived near Eagle from 1915 to 1924, when they moved to the Southwick area. After farming there for three years, they moved to a farm at Gold Hill. Mrs. Cuddy had lived there since that time. Her husband died April 15, 1973.

She was a member of the United Brethren Church and the Women's Christian Temperance Union, a lifetime member of the Women's Missionary Association and a member of the Hill and Valley Garden Club.

Survivors include four sons, Elmer R. and John C. of Kendrick, James T. of Rathdrum and William N. of Thompson Falls, Mont.; three daughters, Ruth Armitage of Lewiston, Rose Ann Holt of Kendrick and Wilma Watson of Council; three brothers, Nathan George of Spokane, Oregon, and John George of Elmer City, Wash.; two sisters, Juanita Gamon of Yakima and Lynne Barker of Kent, Wash.; 35 grandchildren, 55 great-grandchildren and one great-great-grandchild.

The funeral was held at 1 p. m. Friday, Nov. 18 at Malcom's Brower-Wann Memorial Chapel at Lewiston with the Rev. Tim Tucker of the Church of the Nazarene at Deer Park, Wash., officiating.

# Fin-Clipped Idaho Steelhead will be showing up in '85

Department of Fish and Game Idaho anglers who land a steelhead in the fall of 1985 will know they

have a "keeper" for sure if they make a quick check and find the adipose fin missing.

Department of Fish and Game crews will be busy through mid-December clipping the adipose on about 4.5 million of the hatchery-produced fish. They are to be released next spring when they range 6-14 inches in length and the first should be returning from the Pacific Ocean in 1985.

Clearwater River steelhead are processed at Dworshak National Hatchery and those that run the Salmon River are being fin-clipped at the Buhl, Niagara Springs and Hagerman hatcheries in southern Idaho.

Anadromous fishery manager John Coon said fish and game agencies in Oregon and Washington are also involved in the project being funded by the Bonneville Power Administration under the Northwest

Power Council's fish and wildlife plan.

"There has been a very substantial increase in artificial production of steelhead as a result of mitigation programs for hydropower development, but at the same time the hydropower systems have reduced habitat and increased mortalities in wild steelhead populations," Coon said.

A count of some 85,000 Idaho-bound steelhead at Lower Granite Dam is projected for the 1983-84 upstream run which ends next May 31. Last year's Lower Granite count was 72,000 - the best in 12 years.

But the wild fish need protection to maintain runs of naturally spawning fish to upper areas and harvest management is needed so anglers can take advantage of the "abundant" numbers of hatchery fish without overfishing wild populations, Coon explained.

Fin-clipped steelhead should be easy to identify, he pointed out, "but if that adipose fin is on the fish, it will tell the angler that a catch-and-release regulation will be in effect."

Idaho regulations currently require the release of any steelhead with a dorsal fin higher than 2 1/4 inches and identification can be difficult at times.

"Separation of hatchery fish from wild steelhead based on tin characteristics works only for some groups of fish, but the missing adipose fin will provide a clear external mark," Coon said.

## Animal Topics

### FELINE DISTEMPER

The most prevalent disease in cats and the number one cause of feline deaths is distemper, also commonly called cat plague and cat fever. Feline distemper is caused by a virus. This virus is very resistant and can survive for long periods of time outside the cat's body. Most areas where cats are raised are seeded with the virus.

All manner of cats are susceptible to the virus, including lions and tigers. Dogs are not susceptible to feline distemper. Younger animals tend to be more severely affected by the disease. If a susceptible queen contracts the disease while pregnant, her kittens may become infected by breathing or eating the virus.

Signs of the disease are quite varied. Some animals may become infected and show no outward signs of the disease, while in other animals sudden death may occur. In cats that are severely affected a sudden fever along with depression and dehydration is common. Vomiting and diarrhea may also occur. Untreated cats will usually die or recover within a week's time. Cats that do not recover may shed the virus in urine and feces for 3 to 6 months after recovery.

Diagnosis of cat distemper is made primarily on signs of the disease, vaccination history (lack of vaccination), rapid course, and blood tests. Feline distemper will cause a severe reduction of white cells in the blood, cells which are normally present in abundance to help ward off an infection. A relatively simple blood test can determine the number of these cells in a blood sample.


Treatment of feline distemper is aimed at controlling the vomiting and diarrhea, combating dehydration with fluids, and administering antibiotics. Occasionally, a severely affected cat may require a blood transfusion.

Prevention of feline distemper is easily accomplished with vaccination. Kittens may be vaccinated at 9 to 10 weeks of age, followed by a booster shot in 3 or 4 weeks. Annual re-vaccination is recommended to protect young and old cats alike.



### Winter holiday driving requires special caution

The winter holiday driving season begins this month with the Thanksgiving Holiday weekend starting Wednesday, November 12 at 6:00 p. m. and ending Sunday, November 27 at midnight. The Idaho State police are urging extra caution for motorists traveling in potential conditions of poor weather and high traffic.  
 "Winter weather has already arrived at the higher elevations," said ISP Superintendent Col. Calvin Bernard. "People used to realize that the road they may have traveled at 55 mph this summer may not be safe at that speed at this time of year. Every year we see a surge of accidents with the first freeze as motorists haven't adjusted their driving to the more hazardous conditions," he said.

Col. Bernard had a few tips for motorists taking to the road this holiday.  
 —Snow and cold weather have arrived in many areas. Be certain your vehicle is road-ready. Check brakes, lights, defroster, windshield wipers and washer, battery, exhaust and be sure you have adequate tires.  
 —Take along some emergency equipment—tire chains, jumper cables, a shovel, tow chain, emergency lighting and a blanket.  
 —Plan your route in advance and check road reports before you leave.  
 —Keep your timetable flexible in case of adverse weather.  
 —Be rested and alert when you start.  
 —Plan rest stops along the way.  
 —Use proper precautions for winter driving conditions "Ease up in a Freeze-up."

In addition to these tips, Bernard offered two more of special concern. "One, wear your seat belt, no matter how long or short the trip," he said. "Remember, over 70 per cent of all accidents occur with 25 miles from home and by wearing these safety devices a person's chance of

escaping death or serious injury are as much as 65 percent greater. Of the 229 fatalities in Idaho so far this year, 97 percent involved persons who were not wearing seatbelts," said Bernard.  
 "Secondly," said Bernard, "don't drink and drive. It's easy to 'over indulge' at the Thanksgiving table. Don't let this extend to your drinking and then try to drive."  
 Over the Thanksgiving holiday last year (6pm—11/24 to 12 midnight -11/28) three persons died and 65 were injured in traffic accidents on Idaho highways. The ISP will be placing all available officers on the highways this holiday in an effort to limit the accident rate.  
 "Our officers are only a part of what it will take to make this a safe holiday," said Bernard. "If motorists do their share by using common sense and good judgment on the high ways we'll have a holiday we can truly be thankful for."

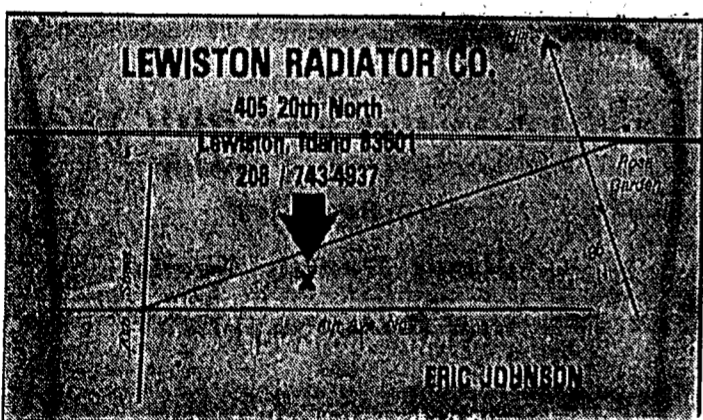
