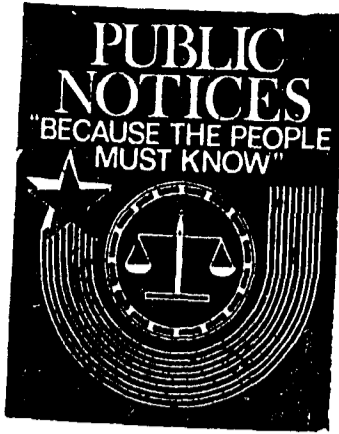

Animal Topics

RABIES

Rabies is caused by a virus and can affect all warm-blooded animals, including man. Rabies is usually transmitted by the bite of an infected animal; however, infection through scratches and cuts is also possible.

Rabies virus is harbored in wild animal populations and tends to be maintained in a particular species in a given area. In our area rabies is maintained in the bat population.

Caution should be used around any wild animal exhibiting unusual behavior, such extreme fearlessness towards humans. Bats that have bitten a pet should be considered rabid until proven negative by laboratory diagnosis.

Diagnosis of rabies is done in the laboratory by confirming the presence of rabies virus in the brain tissue of a suspected animal. The test is performed at a state run laboratory.

Most of the human rabies exposures in the U. S. are from dogs instead of wild animals. In our area, cats are more likely than dogs to become exposed to rabies because they are more likely to catch a sick

Hoffmans Return from Europe

Control of wildlife rabies is very difficult, therefore control of this disease is aimed at vaccinating dogs and cats to provide a barrier between rabid wild animals and humans. Eliminating strays also helps control the disease.

Rabies virus is not very hardy outside an animal's body so local wound treatment is very important. Bite wounds can be decontaminated quite well by thoroughly scrubbing the wound with soap and water.

Rabid animals are easily irritated but don't attack aimlessly. If a non-vaccinated domestic animal is bitten by a known rabid animal then it should be destroyed or put in strict isolation for six months and vaccinated after five months if it remains healthy. Vaccinated domestic animals that are bitten by a known rabid animal should be revaccinated after five months if it remains healthy.
