

Five U of I Stuednts Studying Abroad

While some University of Idaho students are getting settled on campus, five others are trying to orient themselves to studying overseas.

The quintet is on their way as part

of the university's international exchange program.

To reciprocate, four foreign students and a faculty member are at the UI to learn about the American system of higher education. They hail from Finland, France, Canada, West Germany and Tanzania. Additionally, two other foreign students are on campus, recipients of Ella Oleson scholarships. One is from Denmark and the other from the Isle of Man.

The Idaho students, their hometowns, and the countries that they are studying in are: Tracey Carmack, Las Cruces, N. M., Scotland; Melissa Elliott, Eagle River, Alaska, England; and Charles Gallagher, Mark Niederauer and Mark Williamson.

all of Idaho Falls. Gallagher will be studying in Finland, Niederauer in West Germany and Williamson in Tanzania.

The UI exchange program is coordinated by Jack Cooper, international student advisor. In its first formal exchange last year, the program welcomed two students—one from Germany and one from Malta.

Cooper says he thinks the overall number of foreign students studying at UI this year will be about 250, the same as in recent years, although he won't have a firm figure until after the dust of registration settles. He expects approximately 25 to 30 foreign scholars and faculty for the 1984-85 academic year, close to last year's total.

FISH AND GAME FINES TOP \$127,000 IN FY 84

Fish and game law violations resulted in almost 4,000 citations and \$127,000 in fines and forfeitures during fiscal 1984, the Department of Fish and Game reported.

Civil penalties assessed totaled about \$55,800—down slightly from the previous year.

The more common violations included fishing and hunting without licenses or during closed seasons, overlimits, use of illegal gear and failure to observe special fishing regulations where they apply, the computer printout showed.

With seasons for big game and upland game about to get into full swing... the department's enforcement bureau urged hunters to make a careful study of printed regulations to help avoid citations. Here are a few examples:

—Always carry a valid hunting license and carry the proper tag and permit for big game. Validate the tag and attach it correctly immediately after the animal is harvested. Be sure that evidence of sex is shown as the regulations specify and be aware of reporting requirements.

—Upland game hunting areas and bag and possession limits vary. Regulations give specific information about hunting areas and management unit boundaries.

—A fully-feathered wing must remain on all dressed birds to allow identification of species and sex.

—Wanton killing or wasting of any game animal except a carnivore is a misdemeanor.

—It is illegal to party hunt, or help fill another hunter's bag.

It is unlawful to hunt on private land without permission or to shoot from or across a public highway.

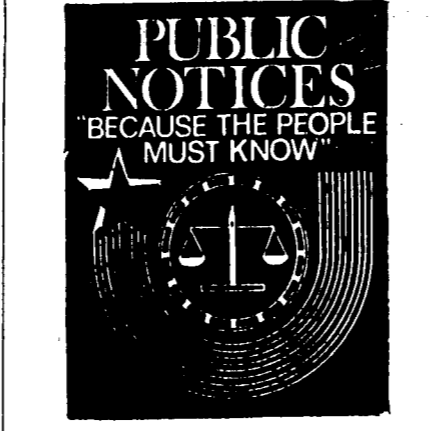

Animal Topics

SKIN DISEASES

Animals suffer from an amazing number of skin diseases; diseases that affect both young and old and occur in both small animals such as cats and dogs and larger animals such as cattle and horses.

Skin diseases have many causes, including allergies, mites, tumors, and infections. The skin is actually the largest organ of the body and because it is exposed to the environment is constantly being challenged by a variety of agents that

can cause disease. There are a number of parasites that inhabit the skin. Fleas are a common parasite and cause an animal to itch excessively, lose condition from constant irritation, and may even scratch or bite itself vigorously enough to cause an open wound (self mutilation). Some individuals become allergic to flea bites and will itch excessively and develop skin conditions after the bite from just one flea.

Mites, another parasite of the skin, cause diseases commonly referred to as mange. Some types of mange are very mild and easily treatable, whereas other types can be difficult to diagnose and exasperating to work with.

Ringworm is caused by a fungal parasite of the skin. Ringworm affects young animals more frequently but any age animal can become infected. Ringworm lesions are most often dry scaly areas that are roughly circular and contain broken hair shafts within them.

Warts are a common problem in cattle during the winter months. Warts tend to affect the head and neck regions and often disappear in the spring.

Sheep and goats are prone to getting skin abscesses. These abscesses are usually localized infections and most often occur around the neck and shoulders.

Some dogs suffer the embarrassment of acne. Canine acne usually occurs at puberty and is character-

ized by black-heads and pustules on the chin and lips. (Gee-whiz).

Skin tumors can occur in any breed of animal but is most notable in the horse. Grey horses have a relatively high incidence of certain types of skin tumors.

Skin diseases in animals can even have a psychological cause. Some dogs will begin licking a particular spot on their leg until it becomes habitual; then the more they lick the more the area becomes irritated and so they lick it more to relieve the irritation which irritates it some more which promotes more licking which . . .
