Shower for Shawna

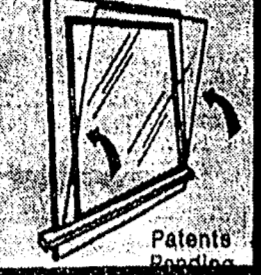
A casual shower honoring Shawna Lindquist was held Monday evening at the Legion Hall. Fall colors of blue and apricot were carried out in the room and table decorations.

The honoree received many lovely and useful gifts and assisting her in opening and displaying them were her sisters, Darci and Allison and cousins, Annie and Courtney Grieser.

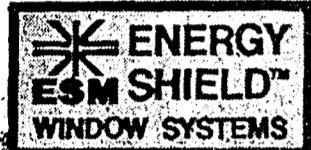

Moscow. One of America's most distinguished poets and editors Stanley Kunitz will read from his poems at the University of Idaho Law School Courtroom at 7:30 p. m. Wednesday, November 14.  
 Kunitz's "Selected Poems" published in 1958, won him the Pulitzer Prize.  
 Many people are familiar with Kunitz's name and work because of his editing of biographical dictionaries of American, English and European authors, usually with Howard Hayercraft. Kunitz's editorial work includes nearly 18 years with the Yale series of Younger Poets.  
 In response to his first collection of poems, which occurred in 1930, Aaron Kramer hailed Kunitz's "technical virtuosity" and praised him as a "poet's poet."  
 A summa cum laude graduate of Harvard university in 1926, Kunitz received his M. A. the next year and worked for 14 years as editor of the "Wilson Library Bulletin," a prestigious library journal presently edited by Milo Nelson, former UI humanities librarian. Kunitz has also served as Library of Congress consultant on poetry, 1974-76, a post sometimes regarded as similar to that of a national "poet laureate."  
 During World War II, Kunitz served in the Army and after the war he taught in several colleges and universities, including Columbia, where he is adjunct professor of writing.  
 Of his own poetry, Kunitz has written: "The vainest ambition is to want an art separated from its heritage, as though tradition were a cistern full of toads instead of a life-giving fountain . . . The way to achieve nobility in art is through the commonplace. Not to overreach . . . but simply to be as true as one can to the grain of the life."  
 His "Selected Poems" of 1978 shows Kunitz's interest in Russian poets, several of whom he has translated into English. He has given readings in the USSR and in Poland. Kunitz's most recent collection of poems is "The Wellfleet Whale," which appeared last year.  
 He is teaching a one-week poetry writing workshop on the UI campus. The Wednesday reading is free and open to the public.

 Moscow, Idaho—A Benewah Co. homemaker who has served the 4-H program for 32 years has been awarded the Distinguished Service Award for the state of Idaho by the Idaho State 4-H Leaders' Association, in cooperation with the University of Idaho state 4-H program.  
 Madeline Morrison, of Tensed, was awarded a silver trophy at the Idaho 4-H Leaders Forum at Pocatello on October 26 in recognition of her outstanding service to youth and to the 4-H program. She has been a 4-H leader for 32 years, and is a leader of the Liberty Butte Hustlers 4-H club.  
 In 1976, she attended the National 4-H Forum in Washington, D. C. as the delegate from north Idaho. For the past two years she has been the president of the Benewah County 4-H Leaders' Association.  
 Morrison has organized many community projects which she and her club have participated in. Some of her community service projects include aiding senior citizens, collecting needed items for fire victims and giving food baskets to the needy. Her 4-H club was awarded a National Grange Award for their community service projects.  
 Morrison was selected from four candidates, one from each 4-H district. The four district winners were selected from nominations from each county within the district. Nominations for the award are based on outstanding service to 4-H, personal development and leadership and citizenship contributions.
