 Six months of training begin December 3 for Clay Cummins and Larry Jindrich before their assignment to patrol areas as conservation officers for the Department of Fish and Game.


Before their training stints end, they will have worked in each of the department's six regions and its headquarters office to familiarize themselves with enforcement procedures and other activities, according to enforcement operations officer Don Nicholson.

The trainees also attend a 5-week course at the Police Officer Standards and Training Academy. They must be POT-certified within a year of their appointment Nicholson pointed out.


Cummins, a resident of Boise, has about 34 months of experience with the department as a temporary employee. He has a B. S. degree in fishery resources from the U.I.

Construction Activity Up, Says Bank Newsletter
 In October, Idaho's residential construction activity rebounded, offsetting the reduced growth rate recorded in September, said James J. Hoogland, Jr. and Roselle Robinson, managers of Kendrick and Genesee banks, a publication of First Security Bank of Idaho, N. A. The report, edited by Dr. Kelly K. Matthews, senior vice president and economist for First Security Corporation will be distributed this week.
 In recent weeks, fixed-rate mortgages have declined noticeably and are currently quoted near 13 percent. These reduced interest costs partially reflecting slowest national economic growth—will be a plus for the housing industry over the next several months.
 Total construction value for authorized building permit construction in 54 major Idaho locations in October was \$48,741,939, or 21.8 percent above 1983. New residential construction for 386 dwelling units totalled \$20,173,266, and increase of 11.6 percent in number and an increase of 33.9 percent in value compared to a year ago.
