Newborn Animals and Cold Weather

Newborn animals require special attention during times of cold; which is especially true for baby pigs. Piglets need to be kept warm and draft-free for their first few days of life, even during mild weather.

New born that are severely chilled can be warmed rapidly by placing them in hot water for 30 minutes to an hour. The temperature of the water should be 105 to 110 degrees Farenheit. Heat lamps and blow dryers can also be used to warm chilled animals. Caution should be used to prevent burns from placing heating devices too close to the skin.

The body parts most susceptible to cold injury are the extremeties. Lambs and calves born in frigid When cold becomes extreme small protects the internal temperature but makes the extremeties more prone to cold injury. This is important in sick animals that are reluctant to stand or move around and in newborns that cannot stand or suck because of cold stress.




