



There are several diseases that respond to selenium supplementation. "White Muscle" disease is perhaps the most widely known problem resulting from an inadequate intake of selenium. Selenium deficiency can cause a muscular dystrophy that affects both skeletail and cardiac muscles. The disease is more prevalent in young, rapidly growing animale and may be precipitated with a sudden increase in exercise.
