Animal Topics

Ear mites in dogs and cats can be a persistent problem. Ear mites cause a lot of irritation and an animal will often self-mutilate its ears in an effort to scratch at the itch that mites cause.

Ear mites may be found on other areas of the body, although they are found in abundance only in the ear. It is felt that ear mites will establish themselves in one ear of an animal, then migrate to the opposite ear later. Ear mites are very contagious and will infest both dogs and cats of any age but are especially prevalent in the young.

The ear mite's life cycle takes about three weeks. Eggs are cemented to the skin and hatch in about four days into a larvae. The larvae feeds for a few days then changes into a nymph form. This nymph feeds for awhile then molts before a second nymph stage which will become an adult.

Diagnosis of the ear mites is relatively easy. Pets will scratch vigorously at their ears; often stopping suddenly while walking or running to sit and scratch the base of the ear in an attempt to relieve the irritation. Often an animal will scratch the hair away from the base of the ear and continue to dig with his claws until a sore has been produced.

The opening to the ear canal often looks very dirty from accumulated crusts and wax. Examination of the ear canal with an otoscope will usually reveal the presence of small white moving mites. Occasionally, microscope examination of ear canal contents is used to diagnose ear mites.

Treatment for the ear mites includes cleaning the ear and using a miticidal preparation in the ear canal. This treatment is continued for about three weeks because the indications presently available will kill only adults mites. In three weeks adults will be back in the ear from previously laid eggs. Treatment is usually effective in ridding an animal of ear mites, but the animal may again become infected if it comes in contact with another animal that has ear mites. All pets in a household should be treated for ear mites simultaneously to help prevent reinfection.





On behalf of the Board of Trustees of the Latah County Free Library District, I am writing to urge your readers to support the M & O override levy which will be voted on by Latah County voters on Tuesday, March 20th. Polls will be open from 3:00 p. m. to 7:00 p. m. at all of the libraries which serve District patrons — Potlatch Branch Library, Genesee Branch Library, Juliaetta Branch Library, Troy Branch Library, Deary Branch Library and the Moscow Library at 110 S. Jefferson. To be a qualified voter in a library election, a person must be a U. S. citizen, at least 18 years of age, and a resident of the library district for at least 30 days. The Latah County Library District includes all areas of the county outside the Moscow city limits. The elected trustees for the district are Betty Burden (875-0955) Margetta Foster (877-1511), Linda Hampton (285-138), Judi Thompson (882-8940), Zoe Cooley (835-3071). The levy will be for \$25,000 each year for fiscal 1986 and fiscal 1987. Each year the \$25,000 will be used to buy books, magazines, and reference materials and to prepare these materials for use by patrons. Based on current levels of assessed value, this levy would increase the library tax by 7/4c per \$1,000 of assessed value. On property with an assessed value of \$50,000, the additional levy per year would amount to \$3.63 — an average price of a paperback book. The trustees believe that the library service in the Moscow-Latah County Library System is well worth

such a modest increase in funding. We believe that library patrons want to find up to date materials available for their use. In the current budget year, fiscal 1985, there is no District funding for book purchases except from contributions. We believe that this situation should not continue in the coming years. For that reason, we urge concerned citizens to vote yes for the override levy.
