Mayor Harold Freeman presided over the meeting of councilmen Jim Cuddy, Bruce May, Dick Groseclose and Frank Gloseclose. Also present was city clerk Nancy Fey, and city employees Ed Campos and Steve Howerton. Guests at the session were Bert Robbins, Carolyn Gravelle, Jack Smith, Elaine Groseclose, Jim Uebelher, Kathy Groseclose and Alice Henson.

Mrs. Gravelle was present to report on the latest activities of the Latah County Centennial Commitee. She is the city's representative on the county board.

Mr. Uebelher is an employee of a Moscow-based televison cable service and was interested in determining if there was interest in the services his company might provide. He feels one of most urgent problems facing the county at present tion and disposal situation. "We're going to outgrow the county landfill quicker than expected," he said and added that finding a workable solution is going to take time and effort.

The county's juvenile detention facilities are inadequate and the county has until December of this year to comply with the new federal mandates. "At present time we don't have the facilities to keep juveniles separated from adult offenders as the law is going to require." he said. This is another matter the county commissioners must face, Parsley added.

Along the same line, Parsley said he was concerned with the high rate to qualified personnel turn-over at the county level in law enforcemeni. In reviewing the problems facing Latah County now and in the future Parsley said there needs to be better harmony and cooperation between county commission board members and all county departments to see the citizens get the most service for their tax dollar.

"County commissioners need to represent all the county," he said, "not just one district." He went on to remind people that there are both urban and rural areas in Latah County and although both may have work together." he said.
