Questions, Answers About Coming School Levy Vote

The following questions are some of the most frequently asked queries of Kendrick School Superintendent Eldon Taylor about the May 17 over-ride levy:

Question: What are deadline dates for registration for the school district's over-ride levy?

Answer: This coming Friday, April 29th, at the local precinct registrar level. A citizen still can register to vote in at their respective county courthouse until Friday, May 6 at 8:00 p. m. Notice this late hour that the 3 counties (Latah, Nez Perce and Clearwater) have agreed to stay open to give citizens an opportunity to register to conform to this new registration law of the 1987 Idaho State Legislature.

Again registration takes less than 30 seconds to fill out the cards and the precinct registrars are:

Latah County—

Question: Does everyone have to re-register for the school election on May 17?

Answer: No depending upon your own individual voting history. If you voted in the last general election (Andrus vs. Leroy for governor) in November 1986 and have not moved in the interim, your name is on the county computer precinct list.

Yes, if you only voted in the last "school" election in May 1987 and did not vote in the general election in 1986 or the presidential election in 1984. If you are unsure or confused about your voting registration status, make a simple telephone call to your precinct registrar and they can tell you over the phone if you are on the county lists. If you are on the lists you may vote, if not then you will have to re-register meeting the qualifications of:

1. 18 years of age or older;
2. Citizen of the U. S.;
3. Resident of school district for 30 days and registered voter of the State of Idaho.

Question: Is this up-coming over-ride levy of \$75,000 for fiscal year 1988-89 and \$65,000 for fiscal year 1989-90 on top of the \$95,000 voters voted on last year?

Answer: No. The \$75,000 over-ride levy for 1988-89 fiscal year reduces and replaces the \$95,000 over-ride levy that expires June 30, 1988. Likewise, the \$65,000 will replace and reduce the \$75,000 over-ride on June 30, 1989. The 1987 legislature permitted school districts to run 2 year over-ride levies to allow them to do longer-range financial planning than the previous yearly over-rides.

He was born March 5, 1914, to David M. and Mary (Ruscoe) Fraser, at Princeton, Idaho, and attended Kendrick schools. He lived in the Kendrick area all of his life.

He married Ethel Slead at Lewiston March 15, 1934. Mr. Fraser worked as a farmer and a logger and enjoyed both activities. His hobbies included gardening, hunting and fishing, and he enjoyed the outdoors. He will also be remembered for his love of children.

Survivors include his wife, Ethel, at their Kendrick home; a daughter, Bernice Proctor, at Deary; a sister Opal B. Forest, at Kendrick; two grandchildren and one great-grandchild.

His parents; two brothers, Kenneth and Everett Fraser; and two sisters, Mabel Barber and Verna Allen died previously.

Funeral services were held at Short's Funeral Chapel in Moscow Saturday at 10 a. m., with Donald Martin of the Deary Community Church officiating.

Phebe Louise Davis, who formerly lived and helped farm on American Ridge, died of cancer Thursday evening, April 21, at Gritman Memorial Hospital in Moscow.

She was born July 2, 1917, in Tyler, Wash., to Merton Wilmot Fockler and Anna Louise (Lehbras) Fockler.

She attended schools in Ewan and Thornton, and graduated in 1934 from the Rosalia High School. She married Wayne Davis on July 25, 1936, at Steptoe, Washington.

They farmed in Moscow, Kendrick and Pullman until their retirement in 1969.

She was active in community, regional and state organizations. She served as 4-H leader for 12 years in Latah County, taught sewing classes in Oakesdale and other communities, and was a member of county homemakers clubs. She served as master of the Kendrick Grange in 1965 and was recently a member of the Ewartsville Grange.

Survivors include her husband, Wayne, at the family home in Pullman; a son, Bruce, at Yakima; a daughter, Joy Greene, at Petersburg, Alaska; two grandchildren; two brothers, Stewart Fockler, at Pullman and Glen Fockler, at Spokane; two sisters, Myrtle Jones, at Moscow and Elma Yarnell, at Spokane.

Darrell Kerby, Cherrylane Democrat Seeks Senate Seat

Darrell Kerby, a Cherrylane resident for the past 36 years and a former Nez Perce County commissioner, recently announced he will seek the Democratic nomination as District 8 State Senator. He will oppose incumbent Ron Beiteltschacher, who is seeking another term.

District 8 was a creation of the Idaho legislature several years ago and includes Idaho, Lewis, Nez Perce, Latah and Clearwater counties.

Kerby, 68, operated a dairy farm in the Cherrylane area until he sold his herd in 1978. He has rented out his farm land and describes himself as "almost retired" from farming.

Darrell, whose family roots go deep into the farming and cattle history of this area, is a graduate of the University of Idaho. He served as a county extension agent in Latah County and then in the same position in Boundary County before becoming assistant manager of the University of Idaho College of Agriculture Research station at Caldwell. He was called back into the military service during the Korean War and following his return to civilian life, went into farming and later the dairy business.

Kerby served five years as a Nez Perce County Commissioner before giving up that position and really hadn't thought about any further political career, he said. Then he had people who begin to approach him about state politics, and some further talking and research led him to think that maybe the present incumbent was getting out of touch with his constituents.

"I've got no axes to grind" he said Tuesday morning, "but I've got a few things I'd like to strive for." He said his main goal, if elected, would be to just work for the best interests of the people and industries in this area.

In addition to his years on the Nez Perce County Commission, Darrell has served on the Lapwai school board for 9 years and has also served on the Federal Land Bank board.

Both of the Kerby sons are graduates of the University of Idaho: one is now employed at Potlatch Forests, and the other works for the Farm Credit Bureau. He also has two daughters and a son-in-law who are teachers.
