## Grange Remembers Christmas Past

Master Frank Jacobson acted as master of ceremonies for the program because his wife, who is lecturer, has stage fright of the worst kind. Even among friends! ## Schupfer Family Era Ends at Potlatch Telephone Company

A chapter in the history of Potlatch Telephone Company will close on December 31, 1988. That is the planned retirement date of Marilyn Schupfer Eichner, former president of the company.

Marilyn will be succeeded by Jerry Brown, a Kendrick native and telephone industry veteran.

Bud and Marilyn Eichner have been with Potlatch Telephone for 33 years. Bud retired as manager in June, 1988, with Marilyn assuming that role for the past six months.

"The telephone industry has been very exciting and a great challenge over the years and we have always considered it a privilege to serve the Kendrick and Juliaetta area," stated the Eichners.

The phone utility, which had been owned by members of the Schupfer family for more than 73 years, was sold to Telephone & Data Systems, Inc. last June. TDS owns more than 80 rural phone companies throughout the U. S., including the phone company which serves Troy.

Jerry Brown, who has been manager of Troy Telephone Company since 1973, will assume management responsibilities for Potlatch Telephone Company beginning January 1, 1989. He will also continue as manager at Troy.

**Student Alcohol/Drug Use Survey Completed**

Lewis-Clark State College's Drug Education Infusion Project has finished its survey of 5,435 jr. and sr. high school students in a local 8-county area. The federally-funded, confidential survey seeks to determine students' and community members' attitudes about drugs, drug use, and drug education techniques.

The survey tests students' factual knowledge about alcohol and drugs, and asks for their opinions on drug availability and use patterns in their own schools and communities. The information obtained will enable LCSC Project personnel to advise 20 Central Idaho and Eastern Washington school districts on substance abuse curriculum implementation.

Students also responded to a series of personal questions that will help enable Project personnel to assess the levels of risk for alcohol and drug abuse present in the region's youth.

Previous studies have indicated that those students at highest risk for drug abuse exhibit at least one of the following:

- low educational achievement (average grade of "D" or "F");
- low religious commitment;
- alcohol use at an early age;
- preceptions that adult acquaintances or peers use drugs (including alcohol);
- belief that parents or peers approve of drug use;
- repeated truancy from school;
- and limited educational plans (do not plan further education after high school.)

Although the Drug Education Infusion Project focuses primarily on education strategies for the school, the implications of this study and others is that public schools actually have some control over only three of the factors that have been shown to place students at risk for alcohol or drug abuse. As a result, a critical aspect of the Project is a program to inform the community at large of its greater role in providing comprehensive drug education that has the effect of reducing alcohol and drug abuse.

Other highlights of the survey:

\* Although some use of all drugs mentioned in the survey is confirmed, use levels in this region are generally below national averages.

\* Predictably, alcohol remains the single most abused drug of all categories listed—only 28% of the respondents have never used it. The average starting age reported is 11.

\* Although 83% of the respondents have never used marijuana, 3% use it at least once a day; on the average, users started at age 14. 45% feel that it would be "easy" to obtain, and the perception of 24% of the respondents is that "many" adults in their community are marijuana users.

\* Over 95% of the respondents have never used cocaine, heroin, LSD, PCP, or other "hard" drugs. However, 16% say that cocaine would be "easy" to obtain, and 8% believe that "many" adults in the community use cocaine. On the other hand, students typically perceive

**Wolverine Search Is Underway in Area**

Once believed to be extinct in Idaho, the wolverine is alive but maybe not well in the state. Craig Groves, Idaho Department of Fish and Game nongame biologist, recently completed a survey which revealed that wolverines may still exist in three Idaho areas—the Selkirk Mountains near Priest Lake, the Lochsa River and Kelly Creek drainages in north-central Idaho; and the Sawtooth-Smoky Mountains of central Idaho.

Wolverines have been protected in Idaho since '65. They are a "species of special concern" for the department, as well as a candidate for listing as a federal threatened or endangered species. They were once widely distributed, but numbers declined in the early 1900s due to predator control efforts.

Groves' original survey, a questionnaire of biologists and trappers statewide in 1985, was detailed in the professional journal Northwest Science. It indicated confirmed and probable wolverine reports in the three areas dating back to 1960.

This winter the Nongame and Endangered Species Program is conducting a survey, jointly funded with the Sawtooth National Forest, to determine the status and distribution

of the wolverine in that area. Posters describing wolverines and their tracks are being distributed in communities in and near the Sawtooth Forest, and anyone sighting a wolverine, or its tracks, should call the Department of Fish and Game or the U. S. Forest Service.

Groves said that "looking for wolverines can be like searching for a needle in a haystack, because they are elusive and inhabit a vast, remote area."

Wolverines look like small bears with relatively short legs and large feet. Their bodies are dark brown with a light stripe along the sides. They weigh 20-30 pounds and occur in high-elevation forested areas. They are often confused with badgers, which are smaller animals with distinct white facial markings. Sightings should be reported to Groves at (208) 334-3402.
