## **Highway Accident Claims Life of** Willy Alford

Kenneth Jack "Willy" Alford, 16, died Monday afternoon, Aug. 21, of injuries he received in an accident at Orofino,

Willy was on a motorcycle when it collided with a United Parcel Service van at Riverside and Highway 7 about 2:10 Monday afternoon. According to a dispatcher with the Idaho State Police, Alford was heading westbound on Highway 7 when an eastbound UPS van driven by Stanley A. Cramer, 36, of Lewiston, made a lefthand turn in front of the motorcycle.

Willy, who was wearing a helmet at the time of the accident, was taken to St. Joseph Regional Medical Center at Lewiston where he later died. Alford was born in Dallas, Texas, January 1, 1973, the son of James and Kathy Alford. The family later moved to Kendrick when his father accepted a position at Kendrick High School. Willy attended schools at Juliaetta and Kendrick and last year was a student at Orofino High mathematics. Willy would have been
