The high tech long distance circuits, in addition to providing high quality transmission service, will serve the company well into the 21st century.

By the end of November all of the company's customers will be hooked up to private line service, according to Brown. The entire project, which is expected to cost more than \$2 million, is being financed by the USDA's Rural Electrification Administration.
