NOTICE OF SCHOOL TRUSTEE ELECTION
Kendrick Joint School District No. 283
Latah, Nez Perce, and Clearwater Counties, Idaho

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN: That, the annual school election of Kendrick Joint School District No. 283, Latah, Nez Perce, and Clearwater Counties, State of Idaho, will be held on May 15, 1990, and the polls at said election will be open between the hours of 12:00 noon and 8:00 o'clock P. M., on said day.

Only those qualified electors residing in Trustee Zone No. 2 may vote for a Zone No. 2 candidate. Only those qualified electors residing in Trustee Zone No. 3 may vote for a Zone 3 candidate. The purpose of said election shall be to elect one trustee to serve for a period of three years from July 1, following the date of the election who resides within Trustee Zone No. 2 and Trustee Zone No. 3.

Trustee Zone No. 2 and Trustee Zone No. 3 are more specifically described as follows:

TRUSTEE ZONE NO. 2—Kendrick.

TRUSTEE ZONE NO. 3—Northern Juliaetta.

Nominations of candidates must be filed with the Clerk of the Election not less than eighteen (18) days prior to the day of election, as provided by Idaho Code, Section 33-502A, no write-in vote shall be counted unless a declaration of intent has been filed with the District Clerk indicating that the person desires the office and is legally qualified to assume the duties of school trustee, if elected. The declaration of intent shall be filed not later than five (5) days before the day of the election.

Polling place for Trustee Zone No. 2 shall be Kendrick High School, Kendrick, Idaho.

Polling place for Trustee Zone No. 3 shall be Juliaetta Elementary School, Juliaetta, Idaho.

That said election shall be by secret and separate ballot.

Absentee voting shall be permitted as provided by Idaho Code, Section 33-405, as amended. Any qualified trustee zone elector who expects to be absent from the District on the day of election or who will be unable, because of physical disability or blindness to go to the polling place may make written application to the Clerk of the District for a ballot of the kind to be voted on at election, which application shall contain the name of the elector and the elector's present address.

As provided by Idaho Code, Section 33-406, as amended, application for an absentee elector's ballot shall be filed with the clerk not later than one (1) hour prior to the opening of the polls. The absentee ballot must be received by the clerk, not later than 8:00 P. M. on the day of the election, before such ballot may be counted.
