Question: How much will lowering the M&O Over-Ride reflect our tax bill?

Answer: A "Yes" vote will decrease taxes very special thanks to the best by 2c per thousand of assessed market value for the 1990-91 fiscal year and 4c per thousand for 1991-92 fiscal year in comparsion to this fiscal year if all else stays constant. Thus a \$100,000 assessed market value of farmland would see a \$2 reduction the first year and a \$4 reduction the second year. A 50,000 home with home owners exemption using a \$5.000 lot value would see a 44c savings the first year and a \$1.10 savings the second year.
