Completes Local Roads And Bridges Survey

Kendrick Grange at its June 5th meeting heard the results of Dick Benjamin's appraisal of the community's roads and bridges. Mailed on to the National Grange in Washington, D. C., the facts and figures from his report will be put into the computer along with data coming in from subordinate Granges all across the nation. The Local Roads and Bridges project is meant to generate some compelling facts and figures, reasons for the Congress to provide more dollars in the 1991 National Highway Bill to meet the

needs of rural America. In completing the report, Benjamin had to access our local roads and bridges generally and then to focus on one specific road or bridge in the area. Dick chose the Cedar Creek Road bridge that crosses the Potlatch. In that connection he had to identify the chief uses of the bridge, the problems encountered there, and the consequence of these problems. In evaluating roads and bridges generally, Benjamin had to determine which kinds of activities generate the greatest volume of vehicle use. He also had to rank activities in terms of their economic importance. In addition, he identified the problems that restrict the use of roads and bridges and that reduce safety on them. When the National Grange publishes its profile of the condition and needs of rural roads and bridges all across the nation, it will be thanks to the data provided by conscientious, community-minded Grangers like Dick Benjamin. Thanks, Dick, for a job well done!

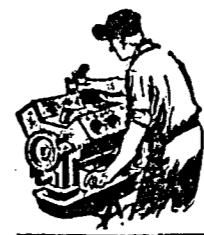
Marcene Smith on Honor Roll at Utah State U.
