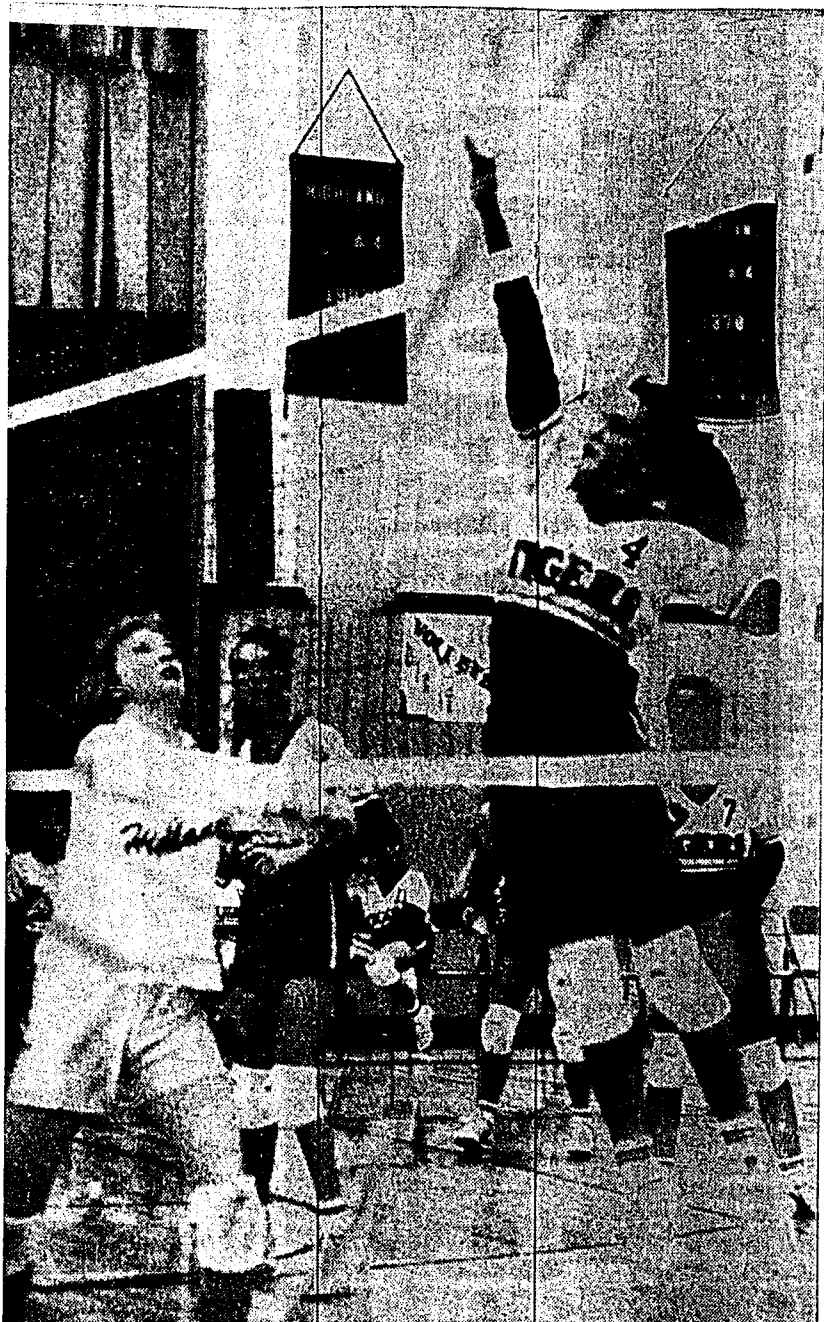

## Tigers Blast Highland 58-12 For Fourth Win

It took the Kendrick Tigers just 30 seconds to score the first of eight touchdowns on their way to a 58-12 victory over Highland of Craigmont Tuesday evening on the KHS field. It was the fourth win of the season for Coach Ken Swanger and his unbeaten Tigers. The loss was the first for the Huskies. This was also another game when the 45-point differential rule ended the contest early in the fourth quarter.

Their quarterback Reece Hewett, who seems to improve each game, wasted little time seeking out Cade Konen. Hewett unloaded a perfectly thrown pass to Konen who ran the ball into the end zone on a play covering 49 yards. Hewett kept the ball himself on the conversion try and made it 8-0 with 11:15 still on the clock.

Konen set up his own next touchdown a few minutes later as he intercepted a Huskie pass on the Highland 35 yard line and brought the ball down to the Highland 2-yard line and on the next play went over the middle for the touchdown. Jarrod Silflow ran over for the extra two points and it was a 16-0 game.

Highland is really a better ball team than the 58-12 score would indicate and several times they showed flashes of why they hadn't been defeated until this game. After the second KHS touchdown, Highland's quarterback Tate Heinzerling broke loose and went 40 yards to the Tiger four before he was stopped, but then fumbled the ball when he was tackled and the Tigers took over. The Huskies sacked Hewett on the first play and Kendrick couldn't move the ball on their next three plays and punted. Highland then drove back down to the Tiger 3 yard line where Hasselstrom passed to Tate Heinzerling in the end zone. Another pass play for the extra points was broken up and the score was 16-6.

The Tigers may have been a little embarrassed by the Huskie score and they struck back quickly with Hewett passing to Bob Wegner who took the ball on the Highland 20, almost stumbled, regained his balance, and went in to score. It was 22-6 after Kendrick's attempt to run over the extra point try failed.  
The Hewett to Konen combination worked again with Reece connecting with Cade on a play covering 28 yards. Again Kendrick's conversion try failed and it was 28-6.

Highland wasn't finished yet despite the top-sided score and almost burned the Tigers on a 70-yard pass play that would have scored if Jarrod Silflow hadn't dragged the runner down just a few yards short of the goal. Konen broke up the scoring threat on the next play, intercepting a Huskie pass to get the ball back just as the first quarter ended.  
There was no scoring in the second quarter and it was a defensive game for both teams. Only a fine run by Hewett who shook off three Huskie tacklers to pick up 27 yards and a Hewett to wide receiver Shawn Tanata on a 21-yard gainer gave the fans much the get excited about.

Both squads were fired up and ready for the second half and Konen would have scored on a 70-yard punt return if the play hadn't been called back on a penalty. Kendrick saw Highland's Hasselstrom gather in a Tiger punt and go 55 yards to score. Highland again couldn't convert the extra point try and it was 28-12.

Kendrick answered that touchdown with four of their own: two from Silflow and two from Hewett. Jarrod, who had 92 yards rushing that night went 27 yards for a Tiger score to make it 34-12 (run failed). Hewett scored from 2 yards out and it was 42-12 after Konen ran over the conversion; Hewett scored again on a 43 yard run after intercepting a pass and again Konen ran over the extra points. And finally with about two minutes gone in the final quarter Silflow mercifully brought the game to an end on a 14 yard gallop and when Konen ran across the points after touchdown, the Tigers had over a 45 point lead and the game was ended.
