Heart Attack Claims Former KHS Supt. James V. Muscat

James V. Muscat, 65, a Lewiston native and former superintendent of Kendrick Jt. School District No. 283. died of an apparent heart attack Sunday, June 16, at Gooding County Memorial Hospital. He was 65.

Muscat taught and coached at Kamiah and St. Maries before moving to Kendrick, where he also taught and coached and was school principal in addition to serving as superintendent.

He was born May 28, 1926, in Lewiston, to Vincent and Minnie Versaci Muscat. He graduated from Lewiston High School in 1944 and attended Lewiston State Normal School (now Lewis-Clark State College) on an athletic scholarship. He earned a degree in education in 1948. From 1948 to 1952, he taught at

Kamiah and then served with the U. S. Army in California

He and Betty Foster weer married in August 1954 and they moved to St. Maries, Idaho, where he-taught and coached while attending the University of Idaho.

Muscat received his master's degree in education from the U. of I. in 1957. He then began his employment with the Kendrick School District.

In 1980, he moved to Gooding, Idaho, where he served as principal and superintendent until 1977. He owned and operated the Sears Catalog Store there until 1980 and then returned to teaching at Bliss High School. He retired in 1983.

Muscat was a Gooding city council member at the time of his death. He also was a member of the Gooding Elk Lodge, Perry Byram Post 30 of the, American Legion and the Gooding Country Club.. He was a communicant of St. Elizabeth's Catholic Church.

In his retirement, he enjoyed hunting, fishing and golfing and was an avid camper.

Betty Muscat died previously. He was engaged to marry Janet Wilhelm on June 26.

Survivors include a son, Clark J. Muscat of Buhl, Idaho; a daughter, Sally J. Toone of Gooding; six sisters, Katie Giandinelli, of Asotin, Rose Cassetto of Lewiston, Irene Keller of Bellevue, Wash., Mary Belveal of Twin Falls, Mag Molesworth of Buhl and Fran Hilding of Sacramento, Calif.; and two grandchildren.

Three brothers died previously. Funeral Mass will be celebrated at 2 p. m. Thursday at St. Elizabeth's Catholic Church at Gooding. Burial will be at the Elmwood Cemetery at, Gooding. The family suggests any memorials be given to Gooding County Memorial Hospital or the Elks Rehabilitation Hospital at Boise.






