Legal Notice

CITY OF KENDRICK, IDAHO ORDINANCE NO. 631

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KENDRICK, A MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF IDAHO, PROVIDING FOR DISCONTINUANCE OF WATER AND/OR SEWER SERVICES (SHUTOFF) TO PREMISES WITHIN THE CITY; PROVIDING THAT DISCONTINUANCE OF SERVICES SHALL BE FOR CAUSE; PROVIDING FOR CONNECTION AND RECONNECTION OF SERVICES; PROVIDING FOR FEES; PROVIDING THAT ANY PROVISION OF ANY ORDINANCE INCONSISTENT WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ORDINANCE BE REPEALED AND THAT THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ORDINANCE BE SEVERABLE; PROVIDING FOR THIS ORDINANCE TO BE IN FULL FORCE AND EFFECT FROM AND AFTER ITS PASSAGE, APPROVAL AND PUBLICATION ACCORDING TO LAW.

WHEREAS, the City of Kendrick has adopted the Uniform Mechanical Code, Uniform Building Code, Uniform Housing Code, and the Uniform Code for the Abatement of Dangerous Buildings; and,

WHEREAS, the Council has determined that it is not in the public interest and it may expose the City and its services to liability and injury if buildings which are in violation of the foregoing codes are connected to the City sewer water system;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KENDRICK AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. DISCONTINUING SERVICE. The City Council may discontinue water and/or sewage ser-

vices to any premises connected to the City's water or sewer system for any of the following reasons:

- A. Failure to pay any outstanding bill which is past due.
B. When the premises violate any City Code to the extent that, in the Council's opinion, the premises constitute a potential danger to the public health, safety or welfare.
C. When the premises are in violation of any code relating to use of the City's water or sewer system.

SECTION 2. PROCEDURES FOR DISCONTINUING SERVICES. Prior to discontinuing delivery of water and/or sewer services to any premises with the City of Kendrick, a written notice that services will be terminated shall be delivered to the owner by personal delivery or certified mail, or shall be posted on the premises, at least three days prior to termination of service, unless it has been declared by the Council that an emergency exists which requires immediate termination of services.

SECTION 3. CONNECTIONS AND RECONNECTIONS: The City Council shall not permit connection or reconection of any premises to the sewer or water system of the City until all applicable fees have been paid to the City. The City Council may deny connection or reconection to the water or sewer of the City or the Council determines the following circumstances exist:

- A. The owner of the premises or the applicant for services has unpaid arrearages owing to the City for utility services.
B. Where the Council finds that the premises are in violation of any City code.
C. Where connection to the sewer or water system would endanger the health, safety or welfare of the residents of the City or the premises.
D. Where the sewer or water system is not adequate to serve the proposed uses on the premises.
E. Where the proposed use of the premises would injure the sewer system or treatment system.

SECTION 4. HEARING. Should the City Council decline to connect any

premises to the City's sewer or water system, the owner or applicant for said services may appeal said decision in writing stating the reason why the premises should be connected. The Council shall consider such appeal at a regular or special City Council meeting within sixty days of receipt of said notice.

SECTION 5. CONFLICTING PROVISIONS, SEVERABILITY. Repeal of conflicting provisions and severability: Any provision of any City of Kendrick ordinance in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance is hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency. Should any provision of this Ordinance be declared unconstitutional or unlawful by a court having jurisdiction, such declaration shall have no effect on the remaining provisions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 6. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication according to law.

PASSED by the City Council and APPROVED by the Mayor this 9th day of July, 1991.
