North Idaho Joins Farm Bureau's Well Testing Effort

Latah and Benewah counties will become the ninth and tenth counties to participate in the Farm Bureau nitrate well testing program later this month.

Latah County Farm Bureau President Don Oleson and Benewah Farm Bureau President Bruce Kidder announced test bottles will go on sale Thursday, Sept. 19 at several locations in each county.

These counties are the first in north Idaho to participate in the Farm Bureau well testing program.

According to Oleson, there are several local water quality concerns that have accelerated need for the nitrate testing program in north Idaho.

"With recent attention focused on some drinking water concerns in north Idaho, we felt it was time to step forward with the nitrate testing program in our counties," Oleson said.

"The testing results generated by University of Idaho Food Quality Assurance Lab will give us the most accurate measurement of nitrate possible."

Latah and Benewah County Farm Bureau members will be meeting on

Sept. 18, at 7pm at the Latah County Grain Growers for an organizational training session according to Bruce Kidder.

"We are asking our volunteers and any other interested individuals who want to help with the well testing program. We welcome those who are not Farm Bureau members to help with the program and participate by testing their wells," Kidder said.

Test bottles will go on sale for \$12, in Benewah County at the Farm Bureau office in St. Maries, Cross Keys Restaurant in Tensed, Gateway Cafe in Plummer, and Fernwood Mercantile in Fernwood.

Bottles will also go on sale in Latah County on Sept. 19 at the Farm
