

FLOOD PLAINS AND WETLANDS NOTICE Notice of Explanation

The City of Juliaetta, Idaho is considering water system improvements which will access the Potlatch River for domestic water. This project would partially be funded by the Idaho Community Development Block Grant (ICDBG) program. The City has filed an application for financial assistance with Farmers Home Administration (FmHA) for the balance of the funding.

The project would entail construction of a domestic water river infiltration gallery and filtration plant. The plant would be located near the Potlatch River north of Middle Potlatch Creek. A segment of the project would be located in the 100 year floodplain. This segment would include construction of the filter backwash water basins and submersible raw water pumping stations and would occur in the river bank. They (backwash basins and pumping stations) will be near riparian wetlands and the raw water lines would be trenched across wetlands. Also, the growth in population facilitated by the project has the potential to indirectly impact other floodplain areas in the community. Proposed improvements cannot be undertaken in any other location. There is, therefore, no practicable alternative to the proposed project. Failure to provide these improvements would result in an insufficiency of domestic water for the community. It is

the City's judgement that the continued viability of the community outweighs consideration of Executive Order 11988 and 11990. A more detailed description of the project and the FIA flood maps are available for citizen review at City Hall, Moday through Thursday, 9:00 a. m. to 1:00 p. m.
