### Wm. L. Rogers, 76, Retired Businessman Claimed by Cancer

William L. (Bill) Rogers, a retired Kendrick businessman and civic leader, died of cancer Wednesday, November 27, at St. Joseph Regional Medical Center in Lewiston. He was 76.

He was born July 28, 1915, at Moscow to L. Milton and Mabel Buchholz Rogers and attended school there, graduating in 1933.

He graduated from Kinman Business College in Spokane in 1936 and returned to Moscow where he worked for a flour mill and for Washburn-Wilson Seed Co. He also did road construction work.

A marriage to Lillian Hazeltime ended in divorce.

He married Emma Lou Vincent Nov. 22, 1945 in Moscow.

They moved to Kendrick in 1953 and he operated a service station and bulk plant, later purchasing both. He sold the service station but continued to run the bulk plant until he retired in 1977.

In 1985 the couple moved to Lewiston, where they have lived since.

Rogers was past president of the Kendrick Lions Club, past zone chairman of Zone 19-E Lions Club and also a Key member. He was also past chairman of Lewis-Clark Council Boy Scouts of America for four years and a former member of the Kendrick Fire Department, serving as fire chief for a year.

He was a member of the Kendrick City Council for four years. He helped start the Kendrick Locust Blossom Festival and served as chairman for seven years.

He was a past member of the Latah Regional Planning Commission and a past member and president for a year of Kendrick Ridge Riders Saddle Club. He was awarded the Second Army "A" Award of the United States, was a past member of the Gritman Memorial Hospital Board of Directors in Moscow, a member of the Clarkston Moose Lodge and a member of the Clarkston Gerontology Choir.

He helped form the Kendrick-Juliaetta Ambulance Service, was past president of the Tanglefoot Square Dance Club and a past president of the Twin City Twirlers.

A licensed auctioneer, he also enjoyed golfing, bird dogs and bird hunting, horseback riding, crafts and writing poetry. In his younger years, he also enjoyed fishing.

Survivors include his wife at the family home in Lewiston; two sons, Budd Gill Rogers of Tacoma, Wash., and Richard R. Rogers of Clarkston; three daughters, Shirley, Easterday of Canoga Park, Calif., Sharon of Eatonville, Wash., and LeAnn, Yeates of Idaho Falls; three sisters, Zella Jones of Everett, Wash., Alice Wickertshamer of Sequim, Wash., and Irene Hites of Moscow. 13 grandchildren and several great-grandchildren.

A memorial service was conducted at 1 p. m. Saturday at Malcom's Brower-Wann Memorial Chapel at Lewiston with the Rev. Robert T. Sievers of the Lewiston First Baptist Church officiating. Burial was at the Normal Hill Cemetery in Lewiston.

**FLOOD PLAINS AND WETLANDS NOTICE**  
Notice of Explanation  
The City of Juliaetta, Idaho is considering water system improvements which will access the Potlatch River for domestic water. This project would partially be funded by the Idaho Community Development Block Grant (ICDBG) program. The City has filed an application for financial assistance with Farmers Home Administration (FmHA) for the balance of the funding.  
The project would entail construction of a domestic water river infiltration gallery and filtration plant. The plant would be located near the Potlatch River north of Middle Potlatch Creek. A segment of the project would be located in the 100 year floodplain. This segment would include construction of the filter backwash water basins and submersible raw water pumping stations and would occur in the river bank. They (backwash basins and pumping stations) will be near riparian wetlands and the raw water lines would be trenced across wetlands. Also, the growth in population facilitated by the project has the potential to indirectly impact other floodplain areas in the community. Proposed improvements cannot be undertaken in any other location. There is, therefore, no practicable alternative to the proposed project. Failure to provide these improvements would result in an insufficiency of domestic water for the community. It is the City's judgement that the continued viability of the community outweighs consideration of Executive Order 11988 and 11990.
