**STUDDERED SNOW TIRES LEGAL NOW TO APRIL 15**

Studded snow tires can be used on Idaho's highways now and until April 15, the Idaho Transportation Department announced.

Studded tires are snow tires with small metal cleats embedded in the tread. They are legal from Oct. 1 to April 15 each year in Idaho.

"Studded tires are normally put on the vehicle's drive wheels only," Jeff Stratten the department's Public Information Officer, said. "But they can be fitted to all four wheels for severe driving conditions."

On front-wheel-drive vehicles, the studded tires should be used on all four tires.

Snow tires, studded or otherwise, must be of the same construction and size as the other tires on the vehicle. Non-radial ply tires, for instance, should not be put on the rear wheels when radial ply tires are on the front wheels.

Motorists should be aware that studded tire laws vary in some neighboring states. Studded tires are legal in Montana and Nevada starting October 1; in Utah, Oct. 15; in Washington, Nov. 1; and Oregon, Nov. 30. Wyoming has no restrictions.


