NOTICE OF TAX INCREASE

Kendrick Joint School District No. 283 has proposed to increase its annual budget by an amount of ad valorem tax revenues that is less than one hundred five percent (105%) of the ad valorem tax revenues certified for its annual budget during the previous year. Its ad valorem property tax rate of one and nine/tenths percent (1.9%) will increase its property tax revenue by three and seven/tenths percent (3.7%). The following percentage schedule is an estimate of what this change may mean to a taxpayer.

CAUTION TO TAXPAYER: The amounts shown in this schedule do NOT reflect tax charges that are made because of voter approved bond levies, override levies, supplemental levies, or levies applicable to newly created taxing districts.

There has been an increase in taxable property values in Latah, Nez Perce and Clearwater County over the last year. Because of this increase in assessed valuation, more taxes will be collected this year than last year.

The new Truth in Taxation law requires that the School District notify its patrons any time there is an increase of more than 5% in the dollars collected for property taxes or increase the tax rate in excess of that certified in the previous year. However, the increase in total dollars collected probably will not increase the dollars available to schools. This is because when the local property tax support increases, the state funding decreases in an attempt to equalize the dollars available to all school districts across the state.

This increase is automatic and in no way affects the supplemental/override levy.
