Auto Accident Sunday Claims Life Of Dustin Smith, 14

Dustin Michael Smith, a student at Kendrick Junior High School and a Southwick, Idaho, resident died of injuries received in a car accident near Lenore Sunday, June 7. He was 14.

He lived in the Southwick area, near Kendrick, most of his life and had just completed the eighth grade at Kendrick Junior High School.
