

Automobile Window Tinting Law Effective July 1

A new Idaho law which limits how dark automobile window tinting may be went into effect July 1. A "grandfather clause" in the law allows persons whose vehicles currently have tinted windows that do not comply to have them inspected and be issued a certificate. Idaho State Police officers will be providing the inspection service between the July 1, 1992 effective date and January 1, 1993. After the January 1, 1993, deadline anyone with a non-complying vehicle may be cited if they do not have the certificate.

Here are some additional details about the new law:
• No tint may be applied to the windshield lower than the AS-1 line (or no lower than 6" from the roof line.)
• Front side windows, front side vents, and the rear window may have tint, but must pass at least 35% light.
• Side windows, to the rear of the driver, may be tinted, but must pass at least 20% light.

No one, (neither tinting shops nor do-it-yourselfers) may apply tints which are in violation of the standards after July 1, 1992.

• Vehicles tinted prior to the July 1, 1992, date may be brought before an I. S. P. officer for inspection. Those that exceed the new standards will be issued a "certificate of non-compliance." This certificate, which must be carried in the vehicle will exempt these vehicles from citations after January 1, 1993. Anyone whose vehicle is not in compliance with the standards after the January 1, 1993 date, may be cited unless they can produce the certificate.

• Vehicles with factory-tinted windows (covered by U. S. Department of Transportation regulations) will not be considered in violation.
• Certificates of non-compliance will be transferred with the vehicle should it be sold.
• Violations of the new statute (Idaho Code 49-944) will be an infraction. (Current fine—\$33.00).
"We have worked diligently on passage of a window tinting law for the past several years," said I. S. P. Superintendent, Col. Ronald Moore. "Overly dark windows create not only a vision problem for the driver, but pose a safety threat to our officers," said Moore. "We believe the new standards still allow motorists to enjoy the benefits of tinted windows yet do not allow people to have windows so dark that they create these safety problems."

By July 20, 1992, Idaho State Police District Two, having jurisdiction in Nez Perce, Latah, Clearwater, Lewis and Idaho counties, will establish inspection sites and dates throughout the area to perform in-

On a warm day, the temperature in a parked car can reach 160 degrees in a matter of minutes, even with partially opened windows. With only hot air to breathe, your pet can quickly suffer brain damage or die from heatstroke. Signs of heat stress are: heavy panting, glazed eyes, rapid pulse, dizziness, vomiting, deep red or purple tongue.

If your pet gets overheated, you must lower his body temperature immediately!
• Get him into shade and apply cool (not cold) water all over his body.
• Apply ice packs or cold towels only to head, neck and chest.
• Let him drink small amounts of cool water, or lick ice cubes or ice cream.

Get your pet to a veterinarian right away—it could save his life! On hot days, your pet is safer at home.

Legislation Affects

Idaho Motorists

A number of legislative changes will affect Idaho motorists beginning July 1, 1992, the Idaho Transportation Department announced.

The use of social security numbers on drivers' licenses, ID cards and instructional permits will gradually be eliminated. Social security numbers will be replaced by a computer-generated nine-digit alphanumeric number.

These new numbers are designed to protect the privacy of Idaho drivers because, unlike social security numbers, they cannot be used to gain unwanted or illegal access to banking accounts or financial records which use the social security number as an identifier.

Motorists applying for a driver's license between July 1 and Dec. 31, 1992, will have the option to use their social security numbers. Those issued on or after Jan. 1, 1993, will display the new computer generated numbers.

"Changing the driver's license

numbers gradually makes it considerably easier on the public," explained Jane Caviness, Driver Services Manager. "Rather than everyone having to get a new number at once, the motorists will be issued a number as they apply for a new or renewed driver's license."

Motorists will still be required to provide ITD with their social security number for internal department use only. Disclosure of the social security numbers is protected by Idaho code.

Other legislative changes beginning July 1, 1992—

- Anyone whose Idaho driver's license has been expired for more than one year will be required to pass the Idaho written test before obtaining another Idaho license.
- ITD may cancel a Commercial Driver's License (CDL) if it is determined that the licensee submitted false information to obtain the CDL.
- Anyone found guilty of driving under the influence of drugs or alcohol for the first time will have their driving privileges suspended for a mandatory period of at least

90 days and no more than 180 days. During the first 30 days of suspension, no driving privileges will be granted. After the first 30 days of mandatory suspension, courts may grant restricted driving privileges.

Idaho Unemployment Increases In June

The Idaho Department of Employment this week announced the seasonally adjusted unemployment rate forecast for June, 1992, at 6.1 percent, up three-tenths of a percentage point from the May, 1992 rate of 5.8 percent.

The number of employed workers in Idaho decreased from May, 1992, by 1,700 to 481,600 in June 1992 and the number of unemployed workers in Idaho increased by 1,500 to 31,400 in June 1992.

Most industries in Idaho experienced continued growth in employment during June. However, the seasonal hiring which normally occurs in June took place in May due to the warm weather, resulting in a higher seasonally adjusted unemployment rate. Idaho should return to normal seasonal hiring patterns this month. Students looking for summer jobs also played a role in the higher unemployment rate for June.

The current level of unemployment is one-tenth of a percentage point below the 6.2 percent unemployment rate experienced in June, 1991 with 5,700 more jobs recorded this year than last year. The outlook for Idaho is continued growth in employment. Idaho's unemployment rate is 1.7 percentage points below the national rate of 7.8 percent.
