One of these concerns is the need for the City of Kendrick to handle the expense involved in improving on main street which would need to be accomplished before a new highway is constructed.

Regarding the problem on Highway 12 east of Arrow Junction, the board said that if the railroad remains, a bridge to cross the creek would have to be built, but if the railway is abandoned, fill could be used to widen the road. Obviously the costs are very different for each method of construction.




