ORDINANCE NO. 636
AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KENDRICK, A MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF THE STATE OF IDAHO, TERMED ANNUAL APPROPRIATION BILL APPROPRIATING MONEY FOR THE PURPOSE OF DEFRAYING ALL NECESSARY EXPENSES AND LIABILITIES OF THE CITY FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING ON THE FIRST DAY OF OCTOBER, 1992, AND ENDING ON THE THIRTIETH DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 1993; ALLOTING SAID APPROPRIATION FOR THE OBJECTS AND PURPOSES SET FORTH IN THIS ORDINANCE; PROVIDING FOR THIS ORDINANCE TO BE IN FULL FORCE AND EFFECT UPON ITS PASSAGE, APPROVAL AND PUBLICATION.
BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KENDRICK, COUNTY OF LATAH, IDAHO, AS FOLLOWS:
SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated out of any money in the treasury of the city of Kendrick, Idaho, not otherwise appropriated, and out of any revenue which the City of Kendrick may acquire between the first day of October, 1992, and the thirtieth day of September, 1993, the following sums:
from tax levied for general purposes, \$ 42,375
from fees and other revenues, 161,284
from fund balance and cash carryovers, 145,069
from sale of city property, 25,000
from grants, 165,000
for a total of \$538,659
which shall be utilized for the purpose of defraying all necessary expenses and liabilities of such corporation for the fiscal year beginning on the first day of October, 1992, and ending on the thirtieth day of September, 1993.
SECTION 2. The following sums are hereby appropriated and allotted for the purpose of defraying expenses and liabilities for the following objects and purposes:

WATER AND SEWER FUND 49,850
SANITATION FUND 24,600

LEGISLATIVE RESERVE 30,000

TOTAL FUNDED EXPENDITURES \$538,659
SECTION 3. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication hereof.

ORDINANCE NO. 260  
AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED THE ANNUAL APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING OCTOBER 1, 1992, APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF \$1,016,452.00 TO DEFRAY THE EXPENSE AND LIABILITIES OF THE CITY OF JULIAETTA FOR SAID FISCAL YEAR, AUTHORIZING A LEVY OF A SUFFICIENT TAX UPON THE TAXABLE PROPERTY AND SPECIFYING THE OBJECTS AND PURPOSES FOR WHICH SAID APPROPRIATION IS MADE. BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Juliaetta, Latah County, Idaho.

Section 1: That the sum of \$1,016,452.00 be, and the same is appropriated to defray the necessary expenses and liabilities of the City of Juliaetta, Latah County, Idaho for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 1992.

Section 2: The objects and purposes for which such appropriations is made, and the amount of each object and purpose is as follows:

Section 3: That a general tax levy on all taxable property within the City of Juliaetta be levied in an amount allowed by law for the general purposes of said City, for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 1992.

Section 4: All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 5: This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force upon its passage, approval and publication in one issue of The Kendrick Gazette, a newspaper of general circulation in the City of Juliaetta, and the official newspaper of the said City.


