No New Taxes, But Water, Sewer

During the City Council's review of the budget for the fiscal year 1992-1993, they found that it will be unnecessary to ask for a property tax increase because the General Fund will have a cash carryover this year. The City has designated these funds for improvements to the city streets and other necessary repairs that the council feels will most serve the needs of the community.

The city has made many improvements to the water/sewer system during the last two years. Utility Services Association, Inc., a leak detection company was hired to locate the leaks in the system last fall. The leaks they discovered have since been repaired and the city has realized a considerable water savings. Over 50 new meters have been installed which helps the city to collect on water overage and to discover new leaks in the system. Numerous repairs have been made sac and Archie Garner of St. George, been completely replaced with new plastic pipe which has proven to be more durable with our type of soil. The council feels that this aggressive approach to solving the problems with the water/sewer system is important if the city is to bring its system in line with government requirements and to continue to furnish the city with a quality water/sewer system.

Unfortunately, the cost of these improvements have caused the Water/Sewer Fund to show a deficit fund balance and Idaho State Code requires an enterprise fund such as the Water/Sewer fund to pay for itself. This fund cannot be subsidized by the General Fund. Therefore, it will be necessary to raise raised to \$8.00. (This rate even with the \$3 raise is still the lowest in the area). This increase will only be sufficient to cover the minimum costs of operating the water/sewer system, the city said. A study of the system will probably raise rates further as the Environmental Protection Agency and the State Department of Health and Welfare Water Quality Division require other changes be made.






