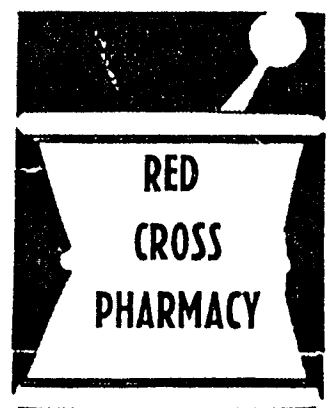

ORDINANCE NO. 260

AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED THE ANNUAL APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING OCTOBER 1, 1992 APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF \$1,016,452.00 TO DEFRAY THE EXPENSE AND LIABILITIES OF THE CITY OF JULIAETTA FOR SAID FISCAL YEAR, AUTHORIZING A LEVY OF A SUFFICIENT TAX UPON THE TAXABLE PROPERTY AND SPECIFYING THE OBJECTS AND PURPOSES FOR WHICH SAID APPROPRIATION IS MADE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Juliaetta, Latah County, Idaho.

Section 1: That the sum of \$1,016,452.00 be, and the same is appropriated to defray the necessary expenses and liabilities of the City of Juliaetta, Latah County, Idaho for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 1992.

Section 2: The objects and purposes for which such appropriations is made, and the amount of each object and purpose is as follows:

General Administration	\$ 22,775.00
Public Safety	7,550.00
Streets	51,625.00
Library	1,800.00
Water Fund	99,446.00
Sewer Fund	77,034.00
Sanitation	27,596.00
Water System Contingency Fund	20,000.00
Sewer System Contingency Fund	20,000.00
Water Project	688,626.00
TOTAL EXPENSES	\$1,016,452.00

Section 3: That a general tax levy on all taxable property within the City of Juliaetta be levied in an amount allowed by law for the general purposes of said City, for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 1992.

Section 4: All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 5: This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force upon its passage, approval and publication in one issue of 'The Kendrick Gazette', a newspaper of general circulation in the City of Juliaetta, and the official newspaper of the said City.

PASSED by the City Council and APPROVED by the mayor of the City of Juliaetta, Idaho this 8th day of SEPTEMBER, 1992.
